
As we prepare for the upcoming holidays, we hope everyone will take a moment to think about what we all are thankful for this holiday season.

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SET YOUR CLOCKS BACK!

It is that time of year again, to "fall back" in time!



Standard time begins on Sunday, November 7, 2021 at 2 a.m. Set your clocks back one hour. This means it will get darker earlier. Here are some helpful tips from MCDOT (Montgomery County Department of Transportation).

- Drivers should be on the lookout for pedestrians, bicyclists, and children.
- Drivers should reduce speed, turn on headlights earlier and be alert.
- Wait for the walk signal. If there is no traffic signal, make sure it's clear to cross. Look left, right and then left again before crossing.
- If there are no sidewalks, walk against traffic so drivers can see you more clearly.

When you switch your clocks, an action we do twice a year, it's a good time to check and change batteries in your smoke detectors!

With falling back on our clocks, take a minute to fall back in time & check out one of the original 1980s brochures for Waters Landing.

CRIME & SAFETY PREVENTION TIPS & HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

We have been notified recently of a few instances of thefts

from vehicles throughout Waters Landing. Please remember to lock your vehicle doors and windows. Vehicle break-ins are when the vehicle is locked; theft from vehicles is when the vehicle is unlocked. LOCK YOUR DOORS.

Malfunctioning porch lights in the front not only encourages criminal activity, but it can also delay emergency rescue when your



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property numbers are not luminated. Consider using a sensor light bulb.

Holiday Safety Tips Provided by MCPD HOLIDAY SHOPPING

While shopping, please lock your vehicle at all times and keep valuables out of sight. It is recommended that if you are shopping at multiple stores that you move your vehicle every time you put packages into it. Criminals will wait in the parking lot to see who places packages in the vehicle then walks away to another store giving them a large window of opportunity to break into your vehicle and steal your packages. Remember to park in well-lit areas and be mindful of your surroundings

TRAVELING

While traveling, think about using an automatic timer for your lights to give the appearance that someone is home. Also ask a trusted neighbor to watch your home and to pick up your mail if you don't have it temporarily stopped. You don't want to tip burglars off that you are away for an extended period of time. As always, please report any suspicious activity to the police department. We can't guarantee a crime won't occur but hardening the target (making it less convenient to commit the crime) will increase your chances of not becoming a victim.



LEAF REMOVAL

Leaf removal is addressed through mowing of the common grounds, as well as two scheduled common ground leaf removals.

The first is scheduled the full week before the Thanksgiving holiday.

The second leaf removal is scheduled for the full week before the Christmas holiday.

Homeowners are responsible for the leaves on their property. There is no street vacuuming for leaf removal in our area. Leaves should be raked and placed in recycle bags to be collected by Montgomery County recycling. There are other options to address leaves, including mulching with your mower and utilizing as mulch around your tree beds.

This is also a good time to clean your gutters to prevent clogged gutters, which can cause water damage.

NEIGHBORHOOD NOTES

These are some of issues and concerns that residents have contacted the Association office with recently:

Waterbury Downs South (Demetrias Way): there is an on-going water leak from one or more private properties along Demetrias Way facing Wisteria Drive. WSSC was called and have conducted their water pressure check on their property, which is from the sidewalk to the property line. Notices from the Association was sent to residents identified by WSSC as potential units who may have a water leak, with instructions

- to contact a licensed plumber to check and repair the water leak.
- Waterbury Downs North (White Church Court): Maintenance work on vehicles in the parking lot is prohibited by our governing documents. Please do not leave car parts, nuts and bolts in the parking lot. Also, if you have an oil leak, please remove the oil as soon as possible to prevent falls by others and run-off into the water system.
- Sunridge (Summersong Lane)- Please be mindful of noise ordinance rules. Trash receptable bins should be out of public view after trash has been collected and not left out in the designated area for trash pick-up. The Association will remove items left on common ground. Most neighborhoods have parking spaces marked by tic marks. Please be mindful to park within the marked parking tic to avoid tight parking and damage to neighboring vehicles.

PEACE & ENJOYMENT — LOUD NOISE

You may be considering hosting or attending holiday parties this year. Homeowners, tenants and guests should be courteous to their neighbors and limit loud noises/gatherings during quiet hours.

Quiet Hours – Weekdays 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. Quiet Hours – Weekends & Holidays 9 p.m. to 9 a.m.

Even loud noises that are causing disturbances during the day may also violate the County's noise ordinance law.

Montgomery County Department of Environmental Protection is tasked with overseeing loud noise ordinance violations.
