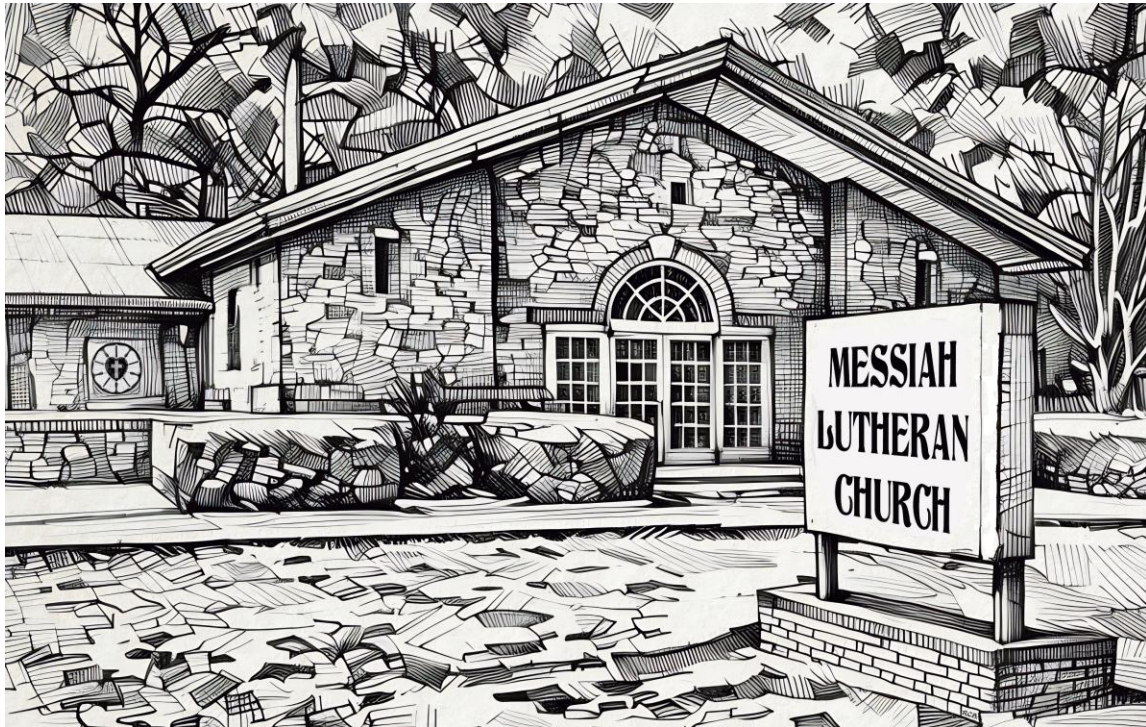

It can seem odd that a woman would compare herself to a dog, and even odder that Jesus would praise her faith for making such a comparison. But he wasn’t praising her for being demeaning; he praised her for realizing how helpless she was without him, for knowing that she needed the Son of God. That is a lesson we can all take to heart: that we need Jesus, because without him we are helpless.

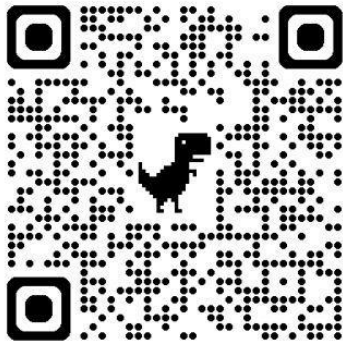
CONGREGATIONAL MEETING – SUNDAY, AUGUST 30th

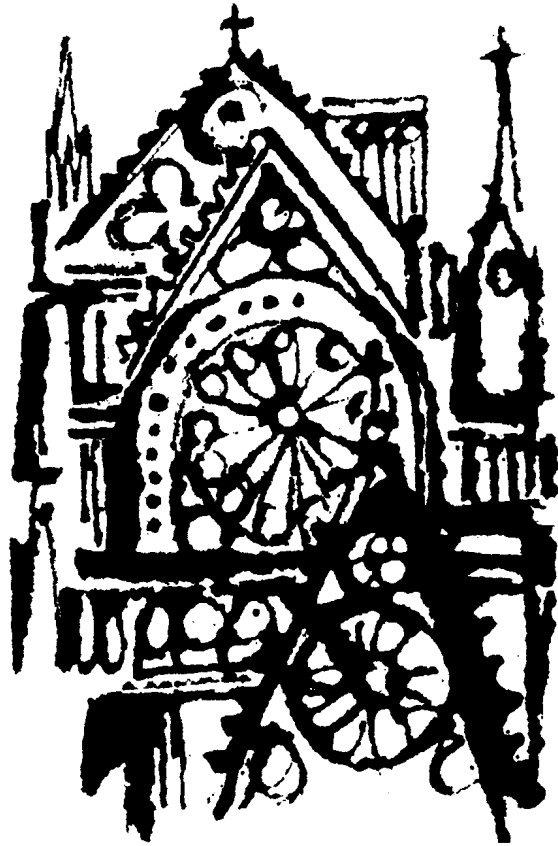
