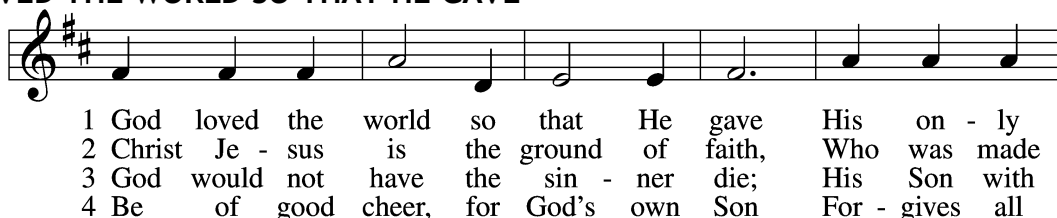

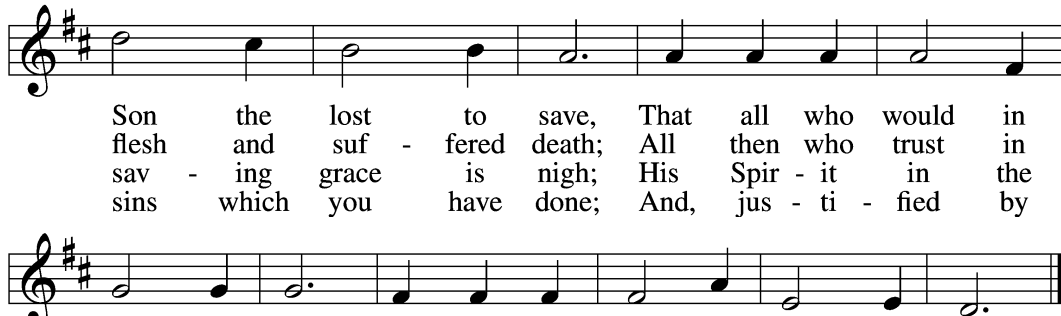

NICENE CREED
