East Lansing, Sept. 15.—*AP*—Michigan State college's football squad was shown pictures of former MSC-University of Michigan games at a skull practice yesterday as Head Coach Charley Bachman continued to sharpen the team for its opener with the Wolverines two weeks hence.

After a scoreless scrimmage, during which forward passing was emphasized, Bachman said his charges were progressing splendidly although they need practice to get more speed and better timing before the Michigan game.

Star Fullback John Breslin of Battle Creek and his understudy, Milford Jones of Eaton Rapids, missed yesterday's practice because of injured feet and ankles, but both were expected to be back next week. Tino Barbas, Detroit end who broke two fingers recently, worked out during passing and blocking drills but did not participate in the scrimmage. Doctors now think he will be able to play in the Spartan opener, Sept. 29.

North Muskegon's Norsemen are set for the opening of the 1945 football season under lights at the Northside field. The opponent will be Class B Grand Rapids Lee, and an outstanding effort will be needed to make the inaugural game under arcs a victorious success.

A chain-wire fence has been erected surrounding the field. Lights will be in completely by Monday, Coach Earl Meyers has announced. Seating capacity of 2,200 persons has been provided with the erection of permanent bleachers to add to the old permanent stands seating 1,500 and temporary bleachers, to seat an additional 700 have been erected.

Thus, one of the biggest crowds in the history of Northside football can be seated, with added space on the sidelines on each side of the field. The new lights, adding the curious to the dyed-in-the-wool football fans, should attract that huge crowd, officials of the Northside school believe.

The Thursday game will start at 7:30 p. m. This time is half an hour before the time printed on the tickets, because Friday students must be in school.

Coach Meyers has a light but apparently scrappy eleven that should line up with Bob Duplissis and either Norm David or Don Buehrle at ends; LaVerne Nicholson and Co-Captain Bob Pyle at tackles; Jim Goudzwaard and either Joe Smith or Joe Weiner at guards; Al Covell or Bud Andregg at center; Ken Kueny, quarter; Ken Barrs, and Co-Captain Marshall Strayer or Cliff Olson at halfbacks, George Felt, fullback.
