Hits 53 Points in Win Over Whitehall 104-81

Gordon Odell, North Muskegon brilliant pivotman, twice wrote his name into the record books last night when he established a new Greater Muskegon high school scoring record for a single game, and set another season scoring mark in leading the Norse sharpshooters to a spectacular 104-81 win over a fast Whitehall quint at the tiny Norse gym.

Scottville Is Winner of 15 Games in Row

Scottville, Feb. 19 — Scottville stormed to its 15th straight win of the season and got revenge for a lot of past indignities by blasting Hart, 73-40, in a West Michigan Conference game here last night.

The red hot Spartans got off to an early lead when Dick Carlson hit two jump shots in the first 30 seconds and rolled up a commanding 28-6 bulge at the end of the first quarter.

Scottville pushed its advantage to 40-15 at the half and upped it to 59-23 at the end of three quarters.

Laverne Brown paced the Spartans with 31 points while Carlson collected 16 and Gary Hansen 14. Nine Scottville players joined in the scoring.

Dave Snell was Hart's best with 15 points.

Hart ran away with the Spartans seconds in the reserve game, 72-56, with Larry Michael getting 23 points for the winners.

Fremont Needs One More Win To Tie for Title

Fremont, Feb. 19 — Fremont Packers scored their eighth Ken-New-Wa League victory, winning over Coopersville 70-59 here last night.

Paced by Bob Walters and Buck Willis, the Packers led the Broncos 19-8 in the first period, and were ahead 45-25 at halftime. A third quarter let down gave Packers fans a scare, as Cliff Bronkema sparked a Coopersville rally to outscore Fremont 19-8.

In the final period the Broncos pulled within five points of Fremont, but were unable to overcome the first half deficit. Bronkema was high man in the game with 25 points and Rycenga had 14 for Coopersville.

Walters led the Fremont scoring with 23, followed by Willis with 22. Holcomb, whose floor work was outstanding had 14 points. Fremont made 70 per cent of their foul shots, 22 of 32, while the Broncos made 15 of 25 or sixty per cent.

Hudsonville played two league games this week, and after last night's win over Sparta is assured of a share of the league crown. The Eagles completed league play with a record of 9-1, losing only to Fremont.

Fremont now has an 8-1 record, and has a good chance of sharing the crown. They must repeat an earlier win over the Chix when they travel to Zeeland next week.

In the preliminary last night, the Little Packers downed the Coopersville reserves 68-40, paced by Ron Workman with 24 points. Fremont held but a six point lead at halftime, 26-20.
