Sweet Marshmallow Kiss

This pattern was designed for Camp Boggy Creek. The dimensions are within their parameters. If you would like to make it larger just continue to repeat rnd. 1 until you reach your desired size.

This is a simple 1 rnd repeat. Remember to turn after every rnd so there will be texture on both sides. Enjoy!

Materials:

Approx. 2,000 yds. of 4wt. Yarn and the corresponding hook for the yarn Darning needle Scissors

Ch. 4 or Magic Ring

Setup rnd. -

Ch3, place 8 3trcl separated by ch2 sp into the ring. Close with hdc into 1st 3trcl

Rnd 1 -

Turn, ch3, 3trcl ch1into ch2 sp, fpdc around 3trcl ch1, 3trcl ch1 in ch2 sp, fpdc around 3trcl ch 1, 3trcl ch2 3trcl ch1 to form corner (all corners will be the same). Repeat around.

Close with hdc or ch2 into 1st 3trcl to complete corner.

Rnd 2 -

Turn, ch3, 3trcl ch1into ch2 (corner sp), fpdc around 3trcl ch1, 3trcl into fpdc ch1, repeat to corner. 3trcl ch2 3trcl in corner. Repeat around. Close with hdc or ch2 into 3trcl to complete corner.

To continue, repeat rnd 2 until your piece measures 40" (or your desired size)

Rows Of Kisses

This pattern was written for Camp Boggy Creek so the dimensions are within their parameters. If you would like to make it larger, just increase your foundation row.

Materials:

Approx. 1,800 yds of 4 wt yarn (or whatever yarn you would like) 6mm crochet hook (or whatever size hook goes with your yarn wt) Scissors
Darning needle

Stitch Description:

Ch chain
Sc single crochet
Dc double crochet
3trccl 3 treble crochet cluster / 3 trebles together
Fpdc front post double crochet
Fpsc front post single crochet

Special Stitches:

Stacked sc- At the beginning of a new row, 1 sc in the first stitch. Insert hook into the vertical loop of the sc just created and place another sc in this loop. It will create a stacked sc.

3trccl- In the same stitch, create 3 treble crochets to form a cluster: (Yarn over twice, insert hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull a loop through the first 2 loops, yarn over and pull a loop through the first 2 loops again); repeat () twice more (4 loops on the hook). Yarn over and pull a loop through all 4 loops.

Foundation Row

*Ch 3, dc in 1st ch, repeat * until you reach 40" (the amount will vary depending on your yarn choice, tension and hook size)

Row 1 - ch 3 or stacked sc ch 1, 3trccl ch1 in each foundation loop across, dc in last ch

Row 2 - ch3 or stacked sc ch1, *fpdc around 3trccl ch1, 3tccl in ch sp ch1, repeat * to end of row, dc in last st

Row 3 - ch3 or stacked sc ch1, *3trccl in dc ch1, fpdc around 3trccl ch1, repeat* across row, dc in last st.

Repeat row 3 until desired length is reached.

Final Row - ch3 or stacked sc ch2, *fpsc around 3trccl ch2, repeat* across (keep your chains loose), dc in last st.
