Legislative/Policy Work

OFA Meetings (8/21, 9/4, 9/18)

1. ODMAP is out!!!

- 1. The small print: ODMAP 2024 will be paid out as follows: 75% if the \$1.68/cwt initially and the other 25% if there is money left over out of the \$58 million still allocated.
- 2. **EVERY farmer** needs to re-register for the 2024 payment using 2023 milk production.
- 3. Reach out to your local FSA office NOW!!!
- Organic Dairy Assistance, Investment, and Reporting Yields Act of 2023 (O DAIRY Act of 2023) Senate Bill 3097
- 3. "The Organic Dairy Data Collection Act" House Bill 6937
 - 1. Met with GT Thompson's staff (House Ag Majority Leader)
 - 2. Met with David Scott's staff (House Ag Minority Leader)
- 4. Farm Bill update:
 - Federal funding expired October 1. Most of the key programs have funding through the end of the calendar year. Then it will revert to "permanent law".
 Both the House and the Senate approved the stopgap spending bills at the end of September to avoid a partial government shutdown. The continuing resolution will keep the federal government running through December 20th.
