

ORGANIC DAIRY FLUID OVERVIEW


New England Organic Milk Sales and Sourcing, Federal Milk Market Order 1, in New England, reports utilization of types of organic milk by pool plants. During October 2020, organic whole milk utilization totaled 12.3 million pounds, down from 17.0 million pounds the previous year. The October 2020 butterfat content was 3.29 percent, up from 3.28 in October 2019. The utilization of organic reduced fat milk in October this year, 13.5 million pounds, dropped from 16.3 million pounds a year earlier. The October 2020 butterfat content for organic reduced fat milk, 1.41 percent, is a decline from 1.42 percent the previous year.

ORGANIC GRAIN FEEDSTUFF OVERVIEW

National Organic Grain Feedstuff. Trading is active on moderate demand for organic feed grade corn. Buyers/sellers transactions are 28 cents lower FOB, with the bulk of activity on spot trades and few forward contracts. Trading is active on good demand for organic feed grade soybeans. The market is trading 90 cents higher FOB, with the bulk of trading occurring in the spot market. Forward contracts are limited. Trade activity is too limited on organic feed grade oats and barley to report, but prices are steady and match current cash bids. All activity for other organic grains is sluggish.

Organic Dairy Retail Ad Summary. This holiday shortened week has prompted a 43 percent decline in total organic dairy retail advertisements, based on the comparison of ad volume from the previous survey period. Organic butter posted a noteworthy jump in advertisements, up 76 percent from the previous organic retail survey. Conversely, all other surveyed retail organic dairy commodities, with calculated percentage changes, exhibited declines. Organic milk ads, half gallon containers, led all organic dairy commodities in retail ad volume. The difference between the half gallon conventional milk price, \$3.99, and half gallon organic milk price,\$4.91, led to an organic premium of \$0.92.

Each advertised organic dairy product and ad percentages, from the most recent Dairy Market News retail survey, are shown in the pie chart below. Organic Dairy Market News reports are released biweekly. They provide market condition information and analysis. The reports include unbiased data concerning market prices and volumes for organic milk and organic dairy products.
