DROUGHT IN THE WEST

WODPA has heard from many producers about the drought in the west and concerns about meeting grazing requirements. The following information details the National Organic Program allowance and opportunity to request a temporary variance for your operation.

The National Organic Program regulations requires the following under **General Requirements for Certification 205.400(f)(2):**

A person seeking to receive or maintain organic certification under the regulations in this part must: (f) Immediately



notify the certifying agent concerning any: (2) Change in a certified operation or any portion of a certified operation that may affect its compliance with the Act and the regulations in this part.

NOP 205.290 – <u>Temporary Variances</u>

NOP Program Handbook – NOP 2606 Instruction on Temporary Variances

It is an operations duty to let their certifier know at the earliest opportunity if they are concerned with their compliance to the act, in this case, the pasture rule. This may then lead to the opportunity to make a temporary variance request as an operation sees necessary.

Your certifier will let you know what additional information they need from you upon receiving your request.

ORIGIN OF LIVESTOCK UPDATE



On May 12, the AMS National Organic Program (NOP) will announce in a Federal Register Notice the reopening of the public comment period for the Origin of Livestock proposed rule originally published in 2015. The comment period will be open for 60 days: May 12 – July 12, 2021.

The Origin of Livestock Notice

proposes revisions to the USDA organic regulations that would change how conventional livestock are transitioned into organic production and how transitioned animals are managed in the organic system. This Notice invites comments on specific provisions that were not considered in the previous 2015 proposed rule, based on public comments to that proposed rule and comments received during the supplemental public comment period in 2019. This additional public comment period will inform USDA's development of a final rule and allows people an opportunity to submit comments on the new information.
