



INGREDIENTS:

- One 6 to 8 in wheel of Brie (*chilled*)
- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry (thawed)
plus extra for design

- 1/4 cup dried cranberries
- 1/4 cup walnuts (*chopped*)
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon water

DIRECTIONS:

Score the sides of Brie all around, cutting through rind. Cut brie in half and lay cut-side up, on a flat work surface. Spread cranberries over one half and walnuts on the other, pressing down gently into cheese. Put the sides back together. Roll out puff pastry on a floured surface to 1/8-inch thickness. Place Brie in the center of pastry. Mix together egg and water in a bowl. Brush egg wash over dough. Fold one edge of dough over Brie and then the opposite side. Fold over the remaining edges to completely encase Brie. Trim off excess dough. Flip Brie over so the seam is on bottom; press sides to snug dough against Brie. Brush the top and sides of wrapped Brie with egg wash. Place Brie in the freezer for 1 hour. Heat oven to 425 degrees F. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Place Brie on sheet bake until browned and leaking cheese, 20 to 25 minutes.
