Revelation the Architecture 12. 1-3 The Woman & Dragon 1-9-2022

Revelation 12. 1-3

1 And there appeared a great wonder in heaven; a woman clothed with <u>the sun</u>, and <u>the moon</u> under her feet, and upon her head a crown of <u>twelve stars</u>:

2 And she being with child cried, travailing in birth, and pained to be delivered.

3 And there appeared another wonder <u>in heaven</u>; and behold a <u>great red dragon</u>, having seven heads and ten <u>horns</u>, and seven crowns upon his heads.

Genesis 37. 9-10

9 And he dreamed yet another dream, and told it his brethren, and said, Behold, I have dreamed a dream more; and, behold, <u>the sun</u> and <u>the moon</u> and the <u>eleven stars</u> made obeisance to me.
10 And he told it to his father, and to his brethren: and his father rebuked him, and said unto him, What is this dream that thou hast dreamed? Shall <u>I</u> and <u>thy mother</u> and <u>thy brethren</u> indeed come to bow down ourselves to thee to the earth?

Romans 9. 3-5

3 For I could wish that myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, **my kinsmen according to the flesh**:

4 <u>Who are Israelites</u>; to whom pertaineth the adoption, and the glory, and the covenants, and the giving of the law, and the service of God, and the promises;

5 Whose are the fathers, and <u>of whom as concerning the flesh Christ came</u>, who is over all, God blessed for ever. Amen.

<u>Isaiah 9. 6</u>

6 For unto <u>us</u> a child is born, unto <u>us</u> a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

Micah 4. 9-10

9 Now why dost thou cry out aloud? is there no king in thee? is thy counsellor perished? for pangs have taken thee <u>as a woman in travail</u>.

10 Be in pain, and <u>labour to bring forth, O daughter of Zion, like a woman in travail</u>: for now shalt thou go forth out of the city, and thou shalt dwell in the field, and thou shalt go even to Babylon; there shalt thou be delivered; there the LORD shall redeem thee from the hand of thine enemies.

Revelation 6.4

4 And there went out another horse that was <u>red</u>: and power was given to him that sat thereon to take peace from the earth, and that they should <u>kill</u> one another: and there was given unto him a <u>great</u> sword.

<u>John 8. 44</u>

44 Ye are of your father <u>the devil</u>, and the lusts of your father ye will do. <u>He was a murderer from</u> <u>the beginning</u>, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.

Job 41. 1, 8, 19-21, 31-34

1 Canst thou draw out <u>leviathan</u> with an hook? or his tongue with a cord which thou lettest down?
8 Lay thine hand upon him, remember the battle, do no more.

19 Out of his mouth go burning lamps, and sparks of fire leap out. **20** Out of his nostrils goeth smoke, as out of a seething pot or caldron. **21** <u>His breath kindleth coals, and a flame goeth out of his</u> <u>mouth</u>.

31 He maketh the deep to boil like a pot: he maketh the sea like a pot of ointment. **32** He maketh a path to shine after him; one would think the deep to be hoary. **33** Upon earth there is not his like, who is made without fear. **34** He beholdeth all high things: he is <u>a king</u> over all the children of pride.

Psalm 74. 10, 13-14

10 O God, how long shall the adversary reproach? shall the enemy blaspheme thy name for ever?
13 Thou didst divide the sea by thy strength: thou brakest the <u>heads</u> of the <u>dragons</u> in the waters.
14 Thou brakest the <u>heads of leviathan</u> in pieces, and gavest him to be meat to the people inhabiting the wilderness.

<u>Isaiah 27. 1</u>

1 In that day the LORD with his sore and great and strong sword shall punish <u>leviathan the piercing</u> <u>serpent</u>, even <u>leviathan that crooked serpent</u>; and he shall slay <u>the dragon</u> that is in the sea.

Daniel 7. 1, 7, 17

1 In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon Daniel had a dream and visions of his head upon his bed: then he wrote the dream, and told the sum of the matters.

7 After this I saw in the night visions, and behold a fourth beast, dreadful and terrible, and strong exceedingly; and it had great iron teeth: it devoured and brake in pieces, and stamped the residue with the feet of it: and it was diverse from all the beasts that were before it; and it had <u>ten horns</u>.
17 <u>These great beasts</u>, which are four, <u>are four kings</u>, which shall arise out of the earth.

Daniel 8. 3-10

3 Then I lifted up mine eyes, and saw, and, behold, there stood before the river a ram which had two horns: and the two horns were high; but one was higher than the other, and the higher came up last. 4 I saw the ram pushing westward, and northward, and southward; so that no beasts might stand before him, neither was there any that could deliver out of his hand; but he did according to his will, and became great. 5 And as I was considering, behold, an he goat came from the west on the face of the whole earth, and touched not the ground: and the goat had a notable horn between his eyes.
6 And he came to the ram that had two horns, which I had seen standing before the river, and ran unto him in the fury of his power. 7 And I saw him come close unto the ram, and he was moved with choler against him, and smote the ram, and brake his two horns: and there was no power in the ram to stand before him, but he cast him down to the ground, and stamped upon him: and there was none that could deliver the ram out of his hand. 8 Therefore the he goat waxed very great: and when he was strong, the great horn was broken; and for it came up four notable ones toward the four winds of heaven. 9 And out of one of them came forth a little horn, which waxed exceeding great, toward the south, and toward the east, and toward the pleasant land. 10 And it waxed great, even to the host of heaven; and it cast down some of the host and of the stars to the ground, and stamped upon them.
