


A High Quality, Respected Network of Care

Currently, residents of Wards 7 & 8 experience long Travel times to receive emergent care

The Fletcher-Johnson FED represents a **20 Million dollar** Investment in the community, providing much needed emergency care to Ward 7 residents, while connecting them to the GW Health network of specialty care

The Fletcher-Johnson FED

- Is an extension of the emergency room at Cedar Hill.
- Will treat all ages of patients from pediatric through geriatric.
- Will have the ability to diagnose, stabilize, and initiate treatment for a wide range of conditions to include heart attack, stroke, and sexual assault.
- Can provide initial stabilizing treatment for gun shots, stabbings, drug overdoses and other traumatic injuries.



Master Plan






Preliminary concept design/ schedule as of April 2024 - subject to change based on all approvals.

Current Sketch of FED

- Covered ambulance bay.
- Lobby and reception area.
- 9 treatment spaces.6 rooms and Rapid Exam area.
- Ability to treat over 100 patients per day.
- CT scanner, X-ray room, portable x-ray, and ultrasound available.
- Full-service laboratory onsite.
- 94% are treated and released.
- Emergency power
- 10,000 and 11,000 square ft.
- UHS has 27 operating in 4 states.
