Volney Ellis Brown
1st Texas Cavalry Co. G
Enlisted: April 28, 1898
Discharged: November 14, 1898



Volney Ellis Brown was born December 8, 1875 in Lavaca County Texas and died on January 29, 1958 in Yorktown, DeWitt County, Texas. He is buried in the Runge City Cemetery in Runge, Texas. He enlisted on April 28, 1898 and was discharged on November 14, 1898. He served as a private in Troop G First Texas Cavalry. As an adult, he worked as a carpenter and farmer. He married twice, Erma Adele Brown in 1899 and Clara Chambers in 1923.

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Volunteers in the Spanish American War

Ernest Henry Gillar Jr.
1st Texas Cavalry Co. G
Enlisted: April 28, 1898
Discharged: November 14, 1898



Ernest Gillar Jr. was born in North Moravia, Czech Republic on January 4, 1878. He came to the United States on October 11 1889 thru the port of New York, NY., setting in Hallettsville. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus and the KJT.

In his early adult life, he taught at two rural schools, Greive and Witting, for 17 years, and farmed the remainder of his life.

He was married twice, to Emilie Sonka in 1907 and Frances Klimitschek in 1948.

Ernest died on June 8, 1963 in the Veteran Administration Hospital in Houston, Texas. He was interned in St. Mary's Cemetery.

Thomas W. Hill
1st Texas Cavalry Co. G
Enlisted April 28, 1898
Discharged: November 14, 1898



Thomas William Hill was born on September 11, 1871 in Bastrop County, Texas. He was the son of Capt. And Mrs. T.A. Hill who moved to Weimar in 1873. T.A. Hill founded the T.A. Hill Bank, later the Hill Bank and Trust Co. Thomas attended Weimer Institute and Texas A&M College and later enrolled in business courses in Poughkeepsie, NY. He worked in his father's bank and later was in the lumber business. At the time of his death on February 19, 1950, he was a director of the Hill Bank and Trust Co., a position he had held for about 25 years. A life long bachelor, Hill was interned in the Weimar Masonic Cemetery.



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
