### A Message from the Executive Director

This past year has been one of momentum, connection, and growth for the Family Resource Centre. What stands out most is not just the programs or improvements, but the way families, staff, and partners came together to make each initiative meaningful.

Children's programs remained at the heart of our work. We introduced new community-based opportunities like Stay 'n Play in Austin, open gym times for toddlers and families, and free bowling nights at Southport. Our After School Programs expanded to EAM and YQS, with a before school option being added at EAM. These programs were made possible thanks to the support and space provided by the Portage la Prairie School Division (PLPSD). We also launched Red Cross' Stay Safe and Babysitting courses to equip youth with important life skills.

In October 2024, we celebrated the opening of the Youth Hub—a project we are proud to have helped bring to life and continue supporting. We also extended our reach through the parenting book collection added to our local library, while funders helped families access more skating gear and essentials. Our food security efforts returned in full strength, with 209 Christmas Hampers delivered with tremendous support of the PLPSD and staff.

We took meaningful steps to improve our spaces with a welcoming mural, refreshed entryway, updated signage, and better storage and organization for the many partners who share our site. We were thrilled to add "Pearl," our new-to-us 2018 Honda Odyssey, which has already become a vital asset to our programs and families.

Looking back, I see both big milestones and small, heartfelt moments—from summer camp adventures to a family opening a Christmas Hamper. These stories reflect our goals: supporting all families, creating welcoming spaces, and offering programs that

nurture wellness, learning, and connection.

I am deeply grateful to our staff, volunteers, and partners. Together, we are building a place where families feel supported, children are welcomed, and everyone belongs.

We also employ a number of part-time & casual staff for our programs along with summer students and placement students each year.




## Our Board

## Our Year In Review

#### A Year of Growth, Engagement, and Community Spirit

#### **Programs for Kids & Families**

- Welcomed 65 children in Before and After School Programs at EAM and YQS
- PD Day Camps averaged 25 participants per session
- Summer camp 2024 hosted 65 children, providing fun and engaging activities
- Offered Stay Safe and Babysitting courses, plus two Infant CPR/First Aid sessions for parents
- Stay 'n Play program available for families in Austin
- Open Gym sessions at Southport encouraged active play for children and parents
- Hosted several evenings of free bowling at Southport

#### **Community Connections**

- Supported the Youth Hub with mentorship and program space
- Launched a parenting book collection at the library and shared additional resources
- Expanded hockey gear collection to help families stay active
- Food insecurity initiatives provided 209 Christmas Hampers to families in need

#### **Enhancing Our Spaces**

- Refreshed indoor and outdoor areas to create a more welcoming environment
- Introduced a new monthly calendar to keep the community informed  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) \left( 1\right)$
- Increased usage of space by community partners
- Added a vibrant welcome mural, updated parking signage, busy board for children, and improved entryway
- Outreach location upgraded with a new shed

## **Stats**

When determining our stats each year we look only at families who have attended at least one program throughout the year. This does not include those we provide services to.

225 families were served.

57% of these families did not attend program the previous year!

We offered over 475 program sessions this year!

We had 83 different accesses to services, including wellness appointments.

We had 33 kids registered in the 10 PD Day Camps.

We had 57 kids signed up for our Before/After School Programs.

We had 65 kids registered in our 2024 Summer Camp.
