Happy Spring! As we do each January, we had our annual meeting. For those who couldn't make it, I'll share a quick summary.

We were fortunate enough to retain our entire board this year for which I am extremely grateful. Thank you, team!

The challenging financial situation MACA is in based on filing too many insurance claims but driven from an overall lack of financial reserves was the focus.

2022 Successes!

Cloud Migration:

We successfully moved nearly all HOA business to a MACA Google Drive.

Website Improvements:

Folks can now make their payments for fines, special assessments, and annual dues on the MACA website. You can find current community information and other useful info, like when the glass recycling goes out.

Replaced remaining original mailboxes:

The remaining 13 mailboxes that hadn't been replaced by insurance were purchased and paid for with the \$75 special assessment last July. Break-ins were reduced from once or twice a month to zero in the past 6 months.

Increased community engagement

Attendance at the monthly meetings is up by 300% from years 2019-2021 Attendance at the annual meeting was up by 75% from years 2019-2021

2023 Goals

- 1) Restore the financial sustainability of the Meridian Acres community.
- 2) Fill the holes in the community green space (Lot #80).
- 3) Start repairing the community owned fences in most need of restoration.
- 4) Reduce speed in the community.

Recent Vote Outcome >

Increase of annual dues by \$39.12 was Approved.

Homeowners were notified by newsletter, website and email regarding a vote at the annual meeting to increase the annual dues by \$39.12. Not enough homeowners attended the annual meeting to have a quorum. Per the CCRs a second vote occurred not sooner than 30 days from previous, this time by mail ensuring each Lot had an opportunity to participate. The vote passed by 59 votes. 104 voted to approve the increase. 45 voted to reject it. The ballots were collected by ballot box (78) and mail-in (71). Votes were certified by two non-board members.

In 1982, the annual association dues were **\$63.00-** equivalent to **\$182.00** today. With the \$39.12 increase, the 2023 annual assessment will total **\$140.00**. Annual Assessment for **2024** will be \$147.00.

Recipe>>>

Pupcakes

Your doggo will love them

- 1 cup oat flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ½ cup shredded carrot
- ½ cup pumpkin puree
- ½ cup apple sauce
- 1/4 cup coconut oil
- ½ cup water
- 1 egg

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Fill muffin tin with paper liners. (*I like the mini muffin tins for this.*) Mix all ingredients together and fill each liner ¼ full. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until cake is firm but springy.

Frosting

Surprisingly frosting like

½ cup plain Greek yogurt ¼ cup peanut butter

Mix yogurt and peanut butter. When cupcakes have cooled sufficiently, frost pupcakes. I double the batch! These freeze well so you can feed sparingly.



Traffic Calming Efforts>>>

In March, one of our members at large contacted Thurston County Public Works attempting to resolve the increased speeds throughout our neighborhood. This issue is noticeably around pickup and drop off times at the pedestrian entrance to River Ridge.

Many likely noticed black tubing on Northwood, 3rd Way, and Stonewood in March. This recorded traffic speeds for approximately two weeks. The results indicated that while some of the higher speeds were picked up on Northwood and 3rd Way, there were also higher rates tracked on Stonewood. The speeding occurrences ranged from 4am - 7am and picked up again from 4pm-7pm. Thurston County Public Works also brought in a radar trailer in April to display speeds; this marked a significant drop in higher speeds throughout the neighborhood, so we are hopeful that residents have become more aware of their activity on our streets.

The next step is community awareness through education. You may see more "Children At Play" signs, and hear discussion of speed bumps in HOA meetings. These bumps can cost upwards of \$3,000 each and we hope to avoid them. In the past 5 years we have many more children than in the previous ten years. Be it low visibility in rainy weather, or increased foot traffic in sunny weather, we all want to be able to enjoy the outdoors safely.

Please slow down, drive carefully and ask guests to, as well.

Spring Gardening Tips>>>

- •Time to feed your lawn. A slow-release formula (low numbers).
 - Prune limbs and branches that were frost or wind damaged.
 - •If your rhododendron and azaleas <u>haven't</u> bloomed, fertilize them. After they've bloomed, fertilize them again.
