

A Very Happy and Blessed Christmas to you all

I wanted to wish you all, in advance, this weekend a very happy and holy Christmas when it arrives in just a couple of days. We celebrate the amazing truth that God, by Whom and in Whom and through Whom, all things were made, took on our human nature and became a defenceless child out of love for you and I, in order to save us. This is not a myth or a story we tell our children - rather God truly entered human history in a particular time and place as a particular man - Jesus of Nazareth, born of the Blessed Virgin with love beyond all telling. After this event, human history and our own lives too can never be the same again. We often hear now the phrase: 'Let's keep Christ in Christmas', but we as Catholics also want to add: 'Let's keep the Mass in Christmas (Christ's Mass) because it was not enough for Our Lord to become poor and defenceless in the stable at Bethlehem, not enough for Him to live as a humble worker with St Joseph for thirty hidden years, not enough for Him to toil and travel for three years proclaiming the Gospel and healing the sick, not even enough for Him to suffer and die on the Cross. This Christmas and every day throughout history, Our Lord Jesus Christ, true God and true man, now lowers Himself further out of love for you and I by coming to us in the Holy Eucharist which continues His Incarnation throughout history in every time and place. In the Holy Eucharist, He is even more fragile, defenceless and silent than He was in the manger at Bethlehem, even more fragile, defenceless and silent than He was on the Altar of the Cross. We would have to have hearts of stone not to respond to a love as deep, humble and selfless as the love of God the Son 2000 years ago in the stable at Bethlehem, but today also on the Altars and in the Tabernacles of our churches. My sincere thanks for all who have helped in any way to prepare for the celebration of Christmas in our Parish. You will have a special remembrance in my Christmas Masses. *O come, let us adore Him, Christ the Lord!*
