

I know I state this a lot, and I don't want to become a 'stuck record' but these fundraising events, as well as new initiatives like the Parish shop, are becoming more and more important in the life of Parishes. The Parish does not receive any external funding, either from the Government or the Diocese - all of our money comes from the kind donations of parishioners, both in the weekly collection at Mass and in our fundraising events. When the Diocese looks at re-ordering and re-structuring, one of the key considerations is financial viability and whether or not a Parish is able to support itself financially going forward. For this reason, it is essential that we are financially robust so that our Parish churches can remain open for many years to come in order to serve future generations.
