

Teaching Sisters of St Dorothy - Daughters of the Sacred Heart

The Bishop has asked us to receive some Sisters into our Parish, the Dorothean Sisters of the Indian Province. There are already some of these Sisters present in our Diocese, currently at St Teresa's, Intack which is in the Parish of Holy Family, Blackburn. Some of you may have come into contact with one of the Sisters who works in the Chaplaincy at Blackburn Hospital. The first of three Sisters who will be living in our Parish will arrive from India before the end of August and will move into the Presbytery at St James the Less. This is very exciting news for the Parish and I am sure the presence of the Sisters will be a great boost for all of us. One of the Sisters will be helping especially in the Parish with various tasks such as ministry to the sick and housebound, Confirmation and First Holy Communion catechesis as well as other ministries which will develop once the Sisters have fully settled in. I am sure the Sisters will be a great help to me, most of all by their example of prayer and their devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. This means we must now begin to prepare for their arrival with us. I have placed at the back of the church a sign-up sheet for any parishioners who would be willing and able to help. As the Sisters will be arriving straight from India, they won't initially have transport or know the area at all. They will need to be present at Holy Mass each day, and as the Mass alternates between the two churches, they will need transport up to St Peter's on the days when Mass is there. Also, they will need help to find local shops etc. If anyone would be willing to help, please do sign up at the back so we can ensure the Sisters are able to settle into our Parish as quickly as possible. And above all, please make them very welcome here in Rossendale and pray for the success of this new chapter in the life of the Parish and the life of the Sisters!
