What is that noise my AC makes?

From time to time we all hear an odd noise or two coming from our air conditioner, especially if it is a little older. It could be as simple as a loose nut or bold, other noises could be a warning sign that something is about to fail.

Squealing – This may be a belt slipping or the bearings of the condenser motor may be wearing.

Clicking – If your A/C is repeatedly clicking it could mean a relay could be going bad. If it's a clicking that happens just when your unit shuts on or off, that's normal.

Banging and or clanking –These types of sounds usually mean there is an issue with the blower assembly or the motor.

Rattling –This type of sound usually means something is coming loose inside your

CORNED BEEF & EGG CUPS

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter, melted, plus more for pan
- 6 slices potato sandwich bread
- 1 small shallot, sliced
- 1 ½ ounces corned beef, chopped
- 1/3 cup baby spinach
- 6 large eggs
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

Preheat oven to 375°F. Brush 6 muffin cups (the deeper the better) with melted butter. With a rolling pin, slightly flatten slices of potato bread (trimming off the crusts if desired). Press into prepared cups and brush with more butter.

Melt 1 tablespoon butter in a small skillet over medium heat. Add shallot and cook, stirring, until softened, 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in corned beef and baby spinach.

Divide filling evenly among cups. Crack 1 large egg into each and season with salt and pepper. Bake until egg whites are almost set, 15 to 20 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

- 2 Are there batteries in your thermostat? Weak batteries can sometimes cause your t-stat to malfunction.
- 3 Breakers, check to make sure non are tripped. Also, check the disconnect by your outside compressor unit.

UV LIGHTS

HOW THEY WORK

UV lights have been widely used in many different industries from food establishments and factories to curing nail polish faster!

Especially in Florida, mold and bacteria are a concern for any homeowner. Indoor allergens are not problematic for everyone but for some, allergens are especially precarious for those of us that suffer from allergies, a respiratory disorder or other health issues. The bottom line is that we all want the cleanest air possible in our homes simply because it can be beneficial to our over-all health.

UV lights use a specific wavelength of light – 254 nanometers to be exact. This light is absorbed by the microorganism’s DNA.

After the microorganism has been exposed to the UV light, it renders it incapable of producing certain proteins it requires to stay alive.

Coil sanitizing lights help prevent microbial growth on your air handler’s coil. This is the most common area for the growth of microbials and bacteria. The coil condenses moisture from the air, dehumidifying your home. The coil is usually damp from this process. As the air passes over the coil, dirt, pet dander and other debris can stick to its wet surface which in turn creates a place for microbials to grow.

Coil sterilization UV lights are designed to be left on continually and shine directly onto the surface of the coil. This helps in preventing microbial growth on your coil.



Remember, if your ductwork is leaking, torn or aged, pollutants from your attic and crawl spaces will restrict the effectiveness of a UV light. Filters – We can’t stress this enough. CHANGE OR CLEAN YOUR FILTERS! Impacted or dirty filters will reduce the effectiveness of your UV Light. Replacement of UV Light Bulb. Generally, bulbs need to be replaced every twelve to twenty-four months dependent on your make and model of UV light.

system. The louder the sound the more serious a problem could be.

• **Humming** – Humming noises most of the time is a capacitor starting to fail. Other times, it could be your motor starting to fail.

A few other signs that could mean you need to have your air conditioning system looked at.

Loud buzzing sounds. This can mean that the isolation feet (the compressor sits on small rubber feet called isolation feet), are degrading or have cracked. If this happens, it can cause the compressor to become unstable which can cause the loud buzzing sound. Loud buzzing can also mean that your compressor may not be working correctly, or that electrical voltage flowing through the outdoor unit is not at the correct amperage. Ice appears on your coils. Normally this is a sign of a refrigerant leak. When this starts to happen, you may notice that your system is blowing warm air or that your system can’t “keep up” in the heat of the day.

If you notice warm air blowing or your system isn’t keeping up in the heat of the day, check your filters too. A clogged or dirty filter can cause your system to blow warm air.

Water Building Up In The Drain Pan

Water in the pan below your air handler. If your system is equipped with a flow switch, your system will automatically shut off to prevent water running over the pan and onto your floor or ceiling dependent on where your air handler is installed. This usually can be corrected by clearing the drain line that may have become clogged with algae or something lodged in the drain line (like a lizard!)

Repair or Replace?

As systems age you may notice they get a little noisier, louder on startup and shutdown. Your electric bills start creeping up as your system becomes less efficient over the years and the AC system seems to run more. You may also notice that your air conditioning system never quite gets to

the temperature you set on the thermostat in the heat of the afternoon in summer. These are all signs.

Do Your Research Now

It has been ten or more years since you have replaced your AC system and equipment has changed! Do you prefer state-of-the-art equipment that is Wifi enabled or simple operation? Choice of SEER ratings, brand, models are just some of the important items you need to research before buying. Equipment, the actual size of the air handler and condenser, may not fit where your current system is. Do you want to consider moving your air handler from the attic or closet to the garage? Have you added a room or would you like to air condition your lanai? All of these are important considerations when you decide to replace your air conditioning system.

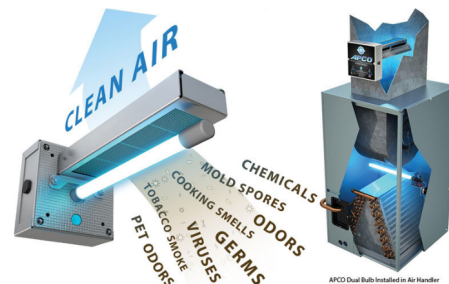

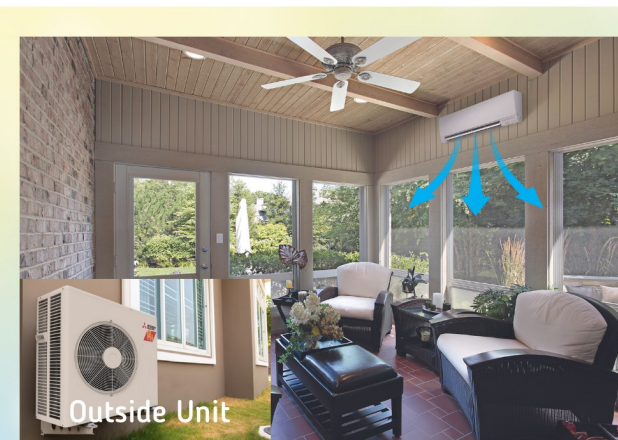
