The materials are forms, black ash weavers and spokes, waxed threads and selected rim filler. Small tools and forms assist in the weaving. Bring small tools and scissors as well as clamps. Needles will be used to sew the lashing for the rims.

Donate what you can cattail cordage. All money will be donated to Animal Rescue Fund of Missisippi where Dana's dog, Barley, was rescued from as he turns 10 on class day November 1st! Drop in anytime during meeting hours – usually 1st time cordage you get about an hour before your hands get too tired.

Discover the hidden strength of a common wild plant in this class focused on making cordage from cattail leaves. Learn how to identify, harvest, and prepare cattails for twisting into strong, natural twine. We'll guide you through basic cordage techniques using dried leaves, and explore how this simple skill can be applied to other wild materials.
