

WINTER RELIEF PROGRAM

OVERVIEW

During January 2026, Social Cooperation Initiative (SCI), with the support of Zakat Foundation of America, implemented a targeted Winter Relief Program aimed at protecting the most vulnerable populations from severe cold conditions in Islamabad and Rawalpindi. The intervention prioritized widowed women, transgender individuals, homeless persons, and women residing in protective shelters.

The program was designed not only to provide essential winter items but also to ensure that assistance was delivered in a manner that upheld dignity, safety, transparency, and inclusion. The intervention combined community-based identification, institutional coordination, and direct outreach to ensure timely and equitable distribution of winter relief items.

The Winter Relief Program successfully met its objectives by reaching highly vulnerable populations with timely, dignified, and transparent assistance. The collaboration with Zakat Foundation of America enabled SCI to respond effectively to seasonal humanitarian needs while reinforcing inclusive and accountable programming practices.



THE NEED

Winter conditions in Islamabad and Rawalpindi pose serious risks for populations lacking adequate shelter, income, or social protection. Prolonged exposure to cold significantly increases vulnerability to illness, insecurity, and psychosocial stress.

Key needs identified included:

- Lack of winter clothing and bedding among low-income households.
- High exposure to cold among homeless individuals living in open spaces.
- Marginalization and limited access to public assistance for transgender communities.
- Dependence of women in protective shelters on external support for basic seasonal needs.

Without timely intervention, these groups face heightened risks of hypothermia, respiratory illness, and reduced personal safety during winter nights.

Zakat Foundation of America kindly agreed to support Social Cooperation Initiative (SCI) and responded positively to the request by providing financial and programmatic assistance, enabling the timely, dignified, and effective delivery of winter relief support to the most vulnerable populations.



BENEFICIARY IDENTIFICATION PROCESS

SCI adopted **context-specific, ethical, and transparent identification methods** tailored to each beneficiary group. No biometric or intrusive verification was used.

Identification Principles

- Prioritization based on vulnerability and exposure to winter risks
- Community validation to avoid exclusion and duplication
- Respect for privacy, consent, and safeguarding standards
- Coordination with recognized institutions where applicable

Identification Methods by Category

Beneficiary Group	Identification Method
Widowed women	Community verification through local volunteers and female focal persons
Transgender individuals	Validation through trusted community representatives
Women in protection center	Official lists provided by center administration
Homeless individuals	Direct field identification through evening outreach visits



DISTRIBUTION PROCESS

Distributions were planned and executed with a strong focus on dignity, order, and accountability. Venues and timings were selected to ensure safety, accessibility, and minimal disruption.

Key Distribution Protocols

- Staggered distribution schedules to avoid overcrowding
- Gender- and inclusion-sensitive staff engagement
- Advance communication with beneficiaries where feasible
- No public labeling, announcements, or forced documentation
- Items pre-packed and pre-counted for accuracy

Distributions to homeless individuals were conducted during evening hours at their locations of residence to avoid displacement and ensure personal safety. A representative of Zakat Foundation of America participated in this activity to reinforce transparency and partnership.

RELIEF ITEMS DISTRIBUTED

Relief packages were adapted to the specific needs of each group while maintaining consistency and fairness.

Items Included:

- Quilts and blankets
- Warm shawls
- Socks and gloves
- Caps and winter hats
- Warm hoodies (where appropriate)

Item quantities were recorded and reconciled against beneficiary lists during each distribution.

IMPACT




IMMEDIATE RESULTS

- Improved protection from cold exposure during peak winter nights
- Reduced anxiety among beneficiaries regarding winter survival
- Strengthened trust between SCI and marginalized communities

PROGRAM VALUE

- Beyond material support, the intervention reinforced SCI's commitment to humanitarian principles, social inclusion, and accountable service delivery.



QUALITATIVE IMPACT

- Widowed women reported increased sense of safety and care
- Transgender beneficiaries highlighted respectful treatment and inclusion
- Homeless individuals received assistance without displacement or stigma
- Institutional coordination reinforced SCI's credibility with public protection services

help them cope with the severe weather,²⁹ members of the transgender community, often among the most neglected segments of society, received winter relief packages.²⁹ Homeless individuals living under bridges were directly reached and provided with essential winter supplies. Additionally,

20 women residents of the Social Protection Women's Center (D-H) were distributed blankets and quilts. Each winter relief package included warm shawls, blankets, socks, gloves, caps, and booties, for both adults and children. Speaking on the occasion, the leadership of the Social


