

July, A.D. 2022 Dear Church Family,

It is trendy in our culture to not bother with coming to the house of the Lord on the Lord's Day. Better things, more pressing things to do, right? Have you ever said, "We can't come to church because we are having company for lunch today." Or, have you ever said, "I can worship God just as well on the river, or out hunting, or while golfing"? I think those are lies from our archenemy, the devil. Such statements may have some truth in them, for Satan almost always mixes truth with his lies. But if it is true, it is true only 167 hours per week. How many hours are there in a week—168, right? So there is *at the very least* one hour per week when you cannot "worship God just as well" doing your own thing. That is especially true in light of the scripture that says, **"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:24-25, NIV). May the Lord awaken the fear of God in us as the Day of Judgment looms.**

Part of my duty as pastor is to **"reprove, rebuke, exhort"** as we read in 2Timothy 4:2. As you read the rest of this, please know that I am aware that there are many who are not present at church because they are truly unable. They are faithful, but cannot be present with us due to age, health, or other legitimate reasons. For those in that category, take this as an exhortation and encouragement. For those members who are not in the Lord's house on the Lord's Day and could be, take this as a reproof and a rebuke.

Let's reason together. Do you know what part of the body you are? And do you know what your spiritual gift is? Maybe you are the right hand at First Baptist, and your spiritual gift is serving others. If you are not in the Lord's House on the Lord's Day, and you are the right hand, then the body of Christ suffers an amputation. If you do show up but you don't serve, then the body of Christ suffers a paralysis. We may get by, but not like we would with everyone both attending and serving. I would guess that any amputee might agree that they can make it through a day and do what they have to do. It just isn't as easy, nor as efficient, as it would be if the person had two hands instead of just one.

In a Gallup poll, the question was asked, "Do you happen to be a member of a church, synagogue, or mosque?" "U.S. church membership was 73% when Gallup first measured it in 1937 and remained near 70% for the next six decades, before beginning a steady decline around the turn of the 21st century." In 2020 it was 47% (news.gallup.com/poll). It is important to understand that those percentages were for *membership, not attendance*. Pew Research did just the opposite. In a study, they tracked *attendance, not membership*. Pew found that 36% of adults attend worship service once per week, while 33% attend once or twice a month/a few times each year, and 30% seldom/never attend (pewresearch.org).

By the way, when I heard at the last annual meeting that we have 441 members, I didn't know whether to laugh or cry. Our attendance averages in the 40s to low 50s. Doing the math, about 10% of our members show up each week. Part of the problem is that we have set the bar too low. Someone might think, "Hey, if that's all they require for membership, church must not be that important." Who could keep a job if they never showed up? What baseball team could win the World Series if only 10% of their players attended practice and games?

His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me" (John 2:17, NIV). Doesn't our Lord deserve better from each of us? We can all do better. There may be situations in which a person with ungodly secrets and habits may be in Sunday worship each week. Likewise, there may be situations in which a person who is very godly stays home and worships with just an open Bible or a good preacher online or on t.v. But, if at all possible, God being our witness, let's make it to church every Sunday. **"And all the more as you see the Day approaching."** Sunday School is at 9:00. Refreshments are served at 11:00. Worship is at 11:20. Call for a ride if you need one.
