

In 1956 the will of Miss Gladys Garnett established a fund to assist students to prepare for Christian ministry.

Over the years, dozens of students have been aided. If you are a <u>Keokuk FBC member</u> and entering a full-time Christian ministry program for the 2025-2026 school year, you qualify.

A second scholarship fund was set up as a memorial to Clauzelle Pfaffe for members or children of members wishing to enter the medical field

A third scholarship fund was set up through the Maxwell Trust. This is for members or children of members of Keokuk FBC who will be entering a post-high school education program.

All monies are given in the form of a non-interestbearing loan. You will be asked to sign a promissory note. If you discontinue your education before the semester of the loan is completed, you will then be expected to begin paying back the loan. If you successfully complete the semester, the loan becomes a gift from Keokuk First Baptist Church.

Application forms for all three scholarships are available in the church office and need to be filled out and returned by June 9, 2025.

If you are aware of students who qualify and may be interested, please pick up an application form for them.

NOTE: For those of you who have filled out the applications in the past, there is no need to fill out the "chosen field" or "spiritual walk" paragraphs if you are continuing the same educational path.

Dear Family of God,

As I write this letter, it is Monday, April 21, A.D. 2025, the day after the celebration of Jesus' rising from the grave. If you look at our electronic sign on the Education Building, it says, "This is no ordinary time; it is Extraordinary Time!" This might need some unpacking as to the meaning. Many Protestants do not pay much attention to the church calendar. I don't. But in the church calendar that the Roman Catholic Church observes, the day after Easter is the end of Lent, and a new season known as Ordinary Time takes the place of Lent. You may ask how long Ordinary Time lasts. It lasts from the end of Lent until the beginning of Advent, which is the beginning of preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem. So, the Catholic calendar's Ordinary Time essentially lasts from April until November each year.

Why did I want our electronic sign to say, "This is no ordinary time; it is extraordinary time"? I wrote that to help our community and our church to understand that once Jesus rose from the dead, that changed everything. No other so-called god has ever done that. Yes, the resurrection changed everything, and still changes everything now, over 2000 years later. No more status quo in our day-to-day lives. No more "ordinary time."

The Apostle Paul did not want to live in an ordinary way, so he wrote in the passage below about just how full of "power" life can be when one decides to "press on," and by God's grace to ultimately be "perfect" and receive "the prize."

Phil 3:10-14 (NASB)—"that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death; ¹¹in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead. ¹²Not that I have already obtained *it* or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus. ¹³Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of *it* yet; but one thing *I do*: forgetting what *lies* behind and reaching forward to what *lies* ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Okay, say it with me, "This is no ordinary time; it is Extraordinary Time!" Live in an extraordinary way! How? Press on! Pray for God's Power! Get the Prize!

Oven-Roasted Corn on the Cob

Oven-roasted corn on the cob is a delicious side. The ears of cornare coated with mayonnaise, Parmesan cheese, chili powder, parsley, and black pepper before being wrapped in foil and roasted in the oven. A great way to prepare everyone's favorite summertime dish!

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 20 mins

Servings: 5

Ingredients

- 5 ears corn, husks and silk removed
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

Directions

- 1. Gather all ingredients.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).
- 3. Cut 5 squares of aluminum foil 1 ½ times the size of the ears of corn; place each ear of corn in the center of a piece of foil. Stir mayonnaise, Parmesan cheese, chili powder, ground black pepper, and fresh parsley together in a bowl until it forms a thick paste.
- 4. Rub about 2 tablespoons of the paste over each ear of corn. Wrap the aluminum foil around the corn and seal. Arrange corn on a baking sheet.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven for 10 minutes, turn, and continue baking another 10 minutes.
