



#### True Prayer Requires Three Things

Dear Church Family,

In Mark 11:22-25 we read, "Have faith in God," Jesus answered. <sup>23</sup> "Truly I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, 'Go, throw yourself into the sea,' and does not doubt in their heart but believes that what they say will happen, it will be done for them. <sup>24</sup> Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. <sup>25</sup> And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."

According to Mark's Gospel, we must pray with no doubt, with lots of belief, and with open-handed forgiveness. "Have faith in God," said Jesus in Mark 11:22. But, what does having faith in God look like?

First, if we have faith in God, we <u>kick doubt out</u>. Jesus tells us that if we say to a mountain to throw itself into the ocean, and we do not doubt but believe, "it will be done for them." Walter Wessel, in the *Expositor's Bible Commentary*, explains that, "Since Jesus was standing on the Mount of Olives, from which the Dead Sea could be seen on a clear day, he may have been referring specifically to this mountain. Of course, Jesus was speaking figuratively, saying that the greatest possible difficulties can be removed when a person has faith." So ask the Lord for things that agree with his will. Then, don't let anyone or anything make you uncertain. Don't have a battle of doubt or wavering within yourself. And, do ask. Then act as though you believe that the Lord hears and will answer your prayer.

If you pray for more hours at work so that you can pay the bills, don't waste your time doubting, worrying, and wavering as to whether the Lord is going to provide. Instead, clear your calendar so that when you are called in to work an extra shift, you are ready to go. That is what it looks like to act as though you believe that the Lord hears and will answer. D.L. Moody said, "If you pray for bread and bring no basket to carry it, you prove the doubting spirit, which may be the only hindrance to the boon you ask" (<u>D.L. Moody</u> Quotes via quotefancy.com).

Second, if we have faith in God, we <u>believe in order to receive</u> (11:23). To have faith means to have total trust, reliance, and confidence. If you are prone to doubt and unbelief, then make this your prayer: "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief" (Mark 9:2)!

Third, <u>forgive with an open hand</u> and so be forgiven (11:25). When you truly forgive someone you let go and pardon the person who hurt or wronged you.

By way of summary and illustration, what kills that pesky fly buzzing around your house? A fly swatter, of course. What kills our prayers? Doubt. Unbelief. Unforgiveness. Those three things are a SWAT team that kills our prayers. Think it over.

Matthew 6:14-15—"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."

Matthew 18:21-22—"Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?' <sup>22</sup> Jesus answered, 'I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times."
