



# Pastor Bob's Corner

October, 2025 Newsletter for the First Baptist Church of Keokuk, IA Dear Church Family,

The one theme that I want to emphasize this month is Jesus's resurrection from the dead. The resurrection of Jesus Christ is not just for the Lenten season.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1Peter 1:3).

2Kings 4:8-37—In this account, Elisha (the successor to Elijah) raised a boy from the dead. You may remember the story: Elisha laid down over the dead boy and "the boy's body grew warm" (4:34), and then "the boy sneezed seven times and opened his eyes" (4:35).

So, why did the writer mention that the boy sneezed seven times, and the boy's body was warming, and the dead boy was opening his eyes? The answer is that the mention of the boy sneezing, the boy's body warming, and his eyes opening, all indicate that witnesses were present to testify that these things really did happen to the boy. The sneezing, the warming body, and open eyes makes the account more credible.

"There are numerous individual and collective resurrections mentioned in the New Testament, including the resurrected Jesus...<u>Lazarus</u>, and <u>Tabitha</u>. Additionally, an unnamed number of "saints" (believers in Christ) were raised from the dead after Jesus' crucifixion" (AI).

Three explicit instances of resurrections from the dead in the Old Testament, were performed by the prophets Elijah and Elisha. All of those who rose bodily from the dead, before Jesus rose from the dead, were—his forerunners. Forerunners of what? Forerunners of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, hundreds of years later.

Jesus Christ is unique in many ways, but he was not unique in being raised from the dead. Jesus was not the first person to be raised from the dead, and he will not be the last. Many others had been raised from the dead in both the Old and New Testaments.

Yet, although Jesus was not unique in being raised from the dead, he and he alone had a unique purpose for being raised from the dead. Among those who had been raised from the dead, Jesus's resurrection—and His resurrection alone—was for the purpose of forgiving human beings of their sins. Until the End,
