Golden Fleece Auction Rules and Regulations

The rules and regulations for the Golden Fleece auction are meant to improve the overall quality of the Jersey Wooly. The Rules and Regulations are as follows:

- 1. All Jersey Woolies entered into the Golden Fleece auction are to be of good quality and free of any disqualifications. (The brood doe and bred doe may be over the weight limit, but weight must be disclosed before the auction.)
- 2. All auction animals will be inspected by qualified persons (ARBA Registrar or Judge) prior to the auction. If there is not a Registrar or Judge available, the animals entered into the auction will be inspected by members of the Auction Committee.
- 3. Any animals found to have a genetic disqualification will not be allowed into the auction and the owners will be notified.
- 4. Complete and up to date pedigrees are required for each Jersey Wooly in the Auction. The pedigree will be given upon payment.
- 5. Each Jersey Wooly that is in the auction, will have a special coop tag on their cage designating that the rabbit is entered into the Golden Fleece auction.
- 6. The owner will receive 50% and the NJWRC will receive 50% of the total sale for the Jersey Wooly, unless the total amount is donated to the Youth Scholarship fund.
- 7. The NJRWC Treasurer will prepare the checks as soon as possible after convention, and mail the checks to the sellers within a two week time frame.
- 8. The time for the Auction will be determined and posted by the show committee. The time and date of the auction must be visible for all exhibitors and visitors to see.

****PLEASE NOTE THAT IF PAYING VIA PAYPAL, THERE WILL BE A \$3.00 FEE ACCESSED TO YOU FOR EVERY \$100 PAID, AS WE CAN NO LONGER TAKE PAYMENT AS "FRIENDS AND FAMILY".****

- 1. The show committee and the auction committee will work together in getting the auction animals in the show coops for inspection and auction. PLEASE ONLY ZIPTIE YOUR GFA/TRIO RABBIT'S CAGE ON SUNDAY NIGHT SO THAT WE CAN ACCESS IT FOR DQ INSPECTION ON MONDAY.
- 2. The animals will be in the show coops 1 hour and 30 minutes before the auction so that they may be inspected for disqualifications.
- 3. Once inspected and buyers notified of any issues, the auction animals will be available for inspection by buyers for 30 minutes.
- 4. The NJWRC is not responsible for injury to potential buyers from sale animals. If the animal demonstrates aggressive behavior, that animal will be dismissed from the auction.
- 5. The NJWRC is not responsible for injury to sale animals from potential buyers.
- 6. Each animal will be put into a coop.
- 7. The auction committee will designate the order in which animals are put up to auction.
- 8. The minimum bid or starting bid for each animals will be \$50.00 If the minimum bid is not met, the animal is considered not sold and returned to coop.
- 9. You do not need to be present in order to bid. Bids may be placed via phone, or by prearrangement through a third party of your choice. The Auction Committee will not be responsible for taking phone or third party bids during the auction.
- 10. There will be no interfering with the auctioneer during the auction.
- 11. Once the auctioneer says, SOLD, that animals is sold to the designated buyer.
- 12. The buyer that buys the animal at the auctioned price is held responsible to purchase the animal for the final auctioned amount. 13. After completion of the auction, the buyer will proceed to the sales clerk and pay for the animal. Check, cash, or paypal is
- accepted. Checks must be made out to the NJWRC. All transactions will receive a bill of sale and paperwork for checkout.
- 14. All buyers are responsible for determining transport for animals purchased in the auction.
- 15. All buyers are responsible for the care of the auction rabbit at the conclusion of the auction.

Note: The Auction Committee is made up of volunteers that want to make the "Golden Fleece Auction" a success. Success can be viewed in many different ways. The ultimate goal of this Committee is to improve the quality of the auction animals so that members may have an equal opportunity in purchasing quality stock from other breeders. Having a good time while doing this is just a benefit we can all share in promoting the Jersey Wooly rabbit.

If I would change anything, I would like to see more length; however, there are no points on length. She is a young senior, so should only get better with age. Our lines usually mature at 2 years old. Her faults are obviously her pattern. She is lightly patterned doe. She has a dot over her spine and a dot on top of her tail plus a few dots on her belly. Her sister and her dam both have plenty of color, so we are thinking she should have modifiers to throw a nicer pattern.

This doe is typey, though I feel she still has some development coming. She has good proportion of head/ear/body size, and appears nicely balanced. Her ear is nicely shaped and carried well. Her coat has good texture and will have good density. Her nails are dark. I would wish for a slightly higher shoulder for her, though she has decent width and chest depth.

I was down between 2 otter does for my donation. Both of them would be beneficial to my herd. The other doe carries shaded where this one does not, so I figured this doe would work easier in more herds. I am having a very hard time deciding between my jrs this year! She is out of the buck that I purchased in the GF Auction last year. Booty Judy was named for my love of her HQ. I really appreciate the width. I really like her depth of shoulder and she is super short. She has had an awesome baby coat with very nice length. We have been trying to focus on length of coat in my rabbits. Although there are no points on length, I find a longer coat to be more striking. She has good density with very good texture on a jr coat. She is currently in her uglies, but looks great for being at that stage in her development. I think she will develop out at a little over 3 lbs. A couple things that I don't like about her: her ear set is a little wide. She does carry them very apart when allowed to relax. They have good shape and substance. She has a good curvature to her skull, but can use more width between her eyes. My heads tend to really pop closer to a year old. I would like to see her a tad shorter about her front limb also. She goes back to T2, our chestnut buck that was BOSB at convention in Louisville in 2022. He currently has 40+ legs and still shows strong at 4 years old. He is out of White On Rice, so she may carry REW.

Great texture and density with very good length. So easy maintenance. Merrigold has a lovely body with a nice top line and rise. She is quite wide and full to the table. She has a beautiful head and her ears are positioned well. I would fault her on slightly thinner ears and she will pinch them. She has been shown quite extensively and successfully on the east coast, but has decided that she likes it less and less. She has less of a presence on the table than she did (more shy), but this does not lessen her value as a brood doe and her overall quality. I am very sad to see her go. I bred her once and she produced a peanut. I have not bred her again due to space, though I had intended to. She has a lovely pedigree including 3Bears, CR (including White on Rice), More's and TAA's Max to name a few.


