






AOV GROUP

POINTED WHITE BLACK

Pointed White—animals will often exhibit a dark sepia coloration, which appears almost black. This is normal, and rabbits should not be disqualified for the dark sepia, or for molting, frosting, or dilution, which makes the color indistinct. The darker the color, and the closer the color approaches pure black, the more desirable it becomes.

POINTED WHITE BLACK—Body Color is to be pure white. Markings (nose, ears, feet, and tail) are to be the color as described in the self-colored variety. Nose marking is to be distinct and run well up the face. Pigment may often be seen below the nose. Ears are to be fully colored and clean cut at the base. Color is to extend as far as possible up the legs. The top and underside of the tail are to be colored. Toenails must show color. Light toenails, showing pigmentation, must match on the same foot and the corresponding foot. Eyes—Ruby pupil, with pink iris.

FAULTS: Very faded color on points, uneven markings, and frosted appearance to the marking color. **DQs:** Tan Pattern markings (nostril, inside of ears, break in color on the insides of the legs, and/or lack of color on the underside of tail), white spot in any marking, complete lack of marking, smut on the usable portion of the wool (eye stain permitted), definite white nail(s), unmatched toenails on the same foot or corresponding foot.

Common Problems: Rabbit carrying non-extension or REW (will affect the size and color of smut), light toenails, very faded color on points, mealy color on points, ears of a different color than nose marking, uneven markings, scattered white hairs in the markings, frosted appearance to the marking color, and soft coat.

Recommended colors to breed: Pointed White-black, blue, chocolate, and lilac. Seal, Siamese Sable (not carrying REW), black or blue (not carrying REW).

AOV GROUP POINTED WHITE BLUE

Blue Pointed White–Rabbits should not be disqualified for molting, frosting, or dilution, which makes the color indistinct. The darker the color, and the closer the color approaches dark blue, the more desirable it becomes.



POINTED WHITE BLUE–Body Color is to be pure white. Markings (nose, ears, feet, and tail) are to be the color as described in the self-colored variety. Nose marking is to be distinct and run well up the face. Pigment may often be seen below the nose. Ears are to be fully colored and clean cut at the base. Color is to extend as far as possible up the legs. The top and underside of the tail are to be colored. Toenails must show color. Light toenails, showing pigmentation, must match on the same foot and the corresponding foot. Eyes–Ruby pupil, with pink iris.

FAULTS: Very faded color on points, uneven markings, and frosted appearance to the marking color. DQs: Tan Pattern markings (nostril, inside of ears, break in color on the insides of the legs, and/or lack of color on the underside of tail), white spot in any marking, complete lack of marking, smut on the usable portion of the wool (eye stain permitted), definite white nail(s), unmatched toenails on the same foot or corresponding foot.

Recommended colors to breed: Pointed White–black, and chocolate. Seal, siamese sable (not carrying REW), black (not carrying REW)

AOV GROUP POINTED WHITE CHOCOLATE

Pointed White-Chocolate. Point color should be a medium chocolate brown, appearing distinctly chocolate. Point color should not be confused with the dark sepia that can be found on a Pointed White-Black. The darker the color and the closer the color approaches a medium chocolate brown, the more desirable it becomes.



POINTED WHITE CHOCOLATE-Body Color is to be pure white. Markings (nose, ears, feet, and tail) are to be the color as described in the self-colored variety. Nose marking is to be distinct and run well up the face. Pigment may often be seen below the nose. Ears are to be fully colored and clean cut at the base. Color is to extend as far as possible up the legs. The top and underside of the tail are to be colored. Toenails must show color. Light toenails, showing pigmentation, must match on the same foot and the corresponding foot. Eyes-Ruby pupil, with pink iris.

FAULTS: Very faded color on points, uneven markings, and frosted appearance to the marking color.

DQs: Tan Pattern markings (nostril, inside of ears, break in color on the insides of the legs, and/or lack of color on the underside of tail), white spot in any marking, complete lack of marking, smut on the usable portion of the wool (eye stain permitted), definite white nail(s), unmatched toenails on the same foot or corresponding foot.

AOV GROUP POINTED WHITE LILAC

Pointed White-Lilac-Points on the animals should exhibit a lilac, a dove gray with a pinkish tint. Rabbits should not be disqualified for molting, frosting, or dilution, which makes the color indistinct. .




POINTED WHITE LILAC-Body Color is to be pure white. Markings (nose, ears, feet, and tail) are to be the color as described in the self-colored variety. Nose marking is to be distinct and run well up the face. Pigment may often be seen below the nose. Ears are to be fully colored and clean cut at the base. Color is to extend as far as possible up the legs. The top and underside of the tail are to be colored. Toenails must show color. Light toenails, showing pigmentation, must match on the same foot and the corresponding foot. Eyes-Ruby pupil, with pink iris.

Faults: Very Faded color on points: uneven markings; frosted in appearance. DQ- Tan Pattern markings, (nostril, inside of ears, break in color on the insides of the legs and/or lack of color on the underside of tail): white spot in any marking' complete lack of any marking' smut on the usable portion of the sool (eye Stain permittted); definite white nail(s); unmatched toenails on the same foot or corresponding foot.

**Recommended colors to breed:
PointedWhite-black , blue,andchocolate. Seal, Siamese sable (not carrying REW), and black (not carrying REW)**
