# Some indicators of Human Trafficking:

- Signs of violence, bruises, black eyes, cuts or marks
- Behaviors including fear, anxiety, nervousness
- Not in control of money or documents
- Accompanied by older "boyfriend"/companion
- Dressed to look older or inappropriately for the weather
- Symbol tattooed or branded on neck, chest, arms

## Who are the traffickers?

They could be:

- Relatives
- Love Partners
- Acquaintances
- Complete Strangers

# How you can help:

- Schedule a speaker for your HOA, business or social event.
- Learn to identify the signs of trafficking and if you See Something, Say Something by calling the national hotline.
- Keep your children safe by monitoring social media accounts.
- Ask local business to post awareness posters.
- Come to a Rotary meeting and become a volunteer.
- Make a donation to RAHT (Rotarians Against Human Trafficking).








SIGNAL FOR HELP: Palm to camera and tuck thumb. Then trap thumb.
