Who is PRUMA

Puerto Rican Union of Mutual Aid, Inc. was organized in May 1937 and incorporated July 7, 1937. Our motto is to "Advance with Progress". Who Can Apply

Priority will be given to members, children, family members and grandchildren of members in good standing who are students of Puerto Rican ancestry who are high school seniors, GED recipients, trade school or college students pursuing an undergraduate education are encouraged to apply. Students must have a 2.0 or higher GPA. Applicants will be assessed on membership, financial needs, academic performance, community service and volunteerism at PRUMA. Several scholarships will be awarded at the annual Scholarship Awards Night. The actual date and location will be announced at a later date. An original completed application, official transcript (or equivalent for trade schools), proof of enrollment/acceptance and a 250-500 word essay must be included. Each essay should be typed and double-spaced, in a font no larger than 12 pts., with a signature at the bottom of the essay. The focus of the essay should be on your future academic career goals, what being "Puerto Rican" means to you, and how you plan to contribute back to this community once you have achieved your goals. Each applicant must submit an approximate 5 X 7 color photo, which will not be returned and becomes the property of PRUMA.
