

COVID-19 Coronavirus Pandemic

In accordance with the City of Atlanta's rollback of its reopening plan to Phase One, the Atlanta City Detention Center (ACDC) remains closed to the general public.

Currently, only essential personnel, detainees, contractors, mental health service providers, vendors, attorneys and individuals conducting essential business are allowed inside the facility, i.e. paying a cash bond for a detainee.



COVID-19 Coronavirus Pandemic

- COVID-19 safety precautions for staff and detainees include: proper hand washing, use of hand sanitizer, providing/wearing masks (N95, KN95, surgical), contactless temperature checks before entrance to facility (and again periodically for detainees while in custody) and practicing social distancing as much as possible
- Continue to encourage staff to get tested
- Known cases of COVID-19 (March 2020-Present)
 - Atlanta Department of Corrections personnel 39
 - Detainees 2

FY21 Cash Bail Reform Statistics

Cash Bail Reform implemented the elimination of cash bonds at the Atlanta City Detention Center on March 1, 2018. Between July 2020 to January 8, 2021, a total of <u>**1,391 pre-trial detainees**</u> have been released on signature bonds per the ordinance.

FY21 Population <u>Average</u> Detainee & Staff

The detainee population for the Atlanta City Detention Center has decreased due to the implementation of the Cash Bail Reform and the COVID-19 Coronavirus Pandemic. To ensure the health and safety of the staff and detainees, only those detainees who are not eligible for bond are required to remain in the facility until seen by a judge via Virtual Court.

- During the pandemic, the Atlanta Department of Corrections has been preparing and delivering three meals daily to the designated isolation hotel for vulnerable citizens
 - April = 1,380 meals
 - May = 14,900 meals
 - June = 23,250 meals
 - o July = 22,128 meals
 - August = 19,131 meals
 - September = 15,335 meals
 - October = 8,764 meals
 - November = 9,053 meals
 - December = 28,675 meals (includes Warming Center meals)
 - Total = 142,616 meals
