New Business:

Ginger Campbell presented the council with a letter to propose a community garden in the Town of Lyman in the side yard at Town Hall. The council requested Ginger put together a committee of people who will be responsible for maintaining the garden if it were to be approved. This will be reviewed again at the next council meeting.

The council reviewed and discussed the findings from the 2020-2023 State Auditor's Accountability Audit. The council advised the clerk to send previous clerk Debora Boyd a letter to recoup questionable overpayments she made while employed with the Town of Lyman.

The council discussed the zoning violations at 8132 Lyman Ave. and 31006 SR 20. There are two recreational vehicles at 8132 Lyman Avenue being used as a place of habitation for more than 6 months which violates zoning. The property is also in dire need of cleanup from a past house fire which happened over a year ago. The council advised the clerk to send a letter to the owner. At 31006 SR 20 there was a huge number of cars

brought on to the property which violates the zoning code. The council advised the clerk to send the owner a letter.

The council reviewed a letter from the public works technician Heather Cagle requesting an increase in pay. The mayor stated that the usual December review of wages and benefits was overlooked. The mayor and council requested additional information on past pay increases and employment details before deciding.
