

Greetings from the East

It has been an incredible journey, filled with amazing memories of time well spent with you all. I begin my reflection by offering profuse thanks to Secretary Randy Crone and to Worshipful Kevin Gourley, our Trestleboard Editor and Website Administrator, for taking on those daunting tasks. One of the keys to our successful year has been our ability to communicate more directly with you, and they deserve recognition for their vigilance. Between our Secretary's emails, the up-to-date calendar and website, and our revamped Trestleboard, we hope you've felt more connected to everything happening in your Lodge.

In 2024 Tropical Lodge has hosted some wonderful events, like our 3rd Annual *Houdini Night* and a *Past Master & Awards Night*, which included getting to work with some awesome Brothers in the kitchen preparing those delicious meals and spending quality time with you and your families. On St. Patrick's Day we had our *1st Annual Kilt Night*, with Brothers showing up in proper attire from Lodges throughout the district, and a traditional Irish meal. We also had Ft. Myers Beach No. 362 visit that night to participate in some Traveling Gavel games; the fellowship was great. Working with Worshipful Pennewaert and Cape Coral No. 367, thanks to his leadership, we participated in a *Lent Fish Fry* to raise money for charity initiatives and build the bonds of Brotherhood between our Lodges. In that same vein, Worshipful Rick worked with Lee County EMS to set up a joint CPR/AED class for our Lodges so we have better prepared Brothers in case of an emergency, which we will continue to hold in the coming years.

Tropical Lodge has also seen its share of ritual work this year, having conferred a Fellow Craft and Entered Apprentice Degree in our Lodge, including courtesy work for Punta Gorda No. 115. We were fortunate enough to work with 24th District Lodges as they provided courtesy work for us, allowing us to participate in Cape Coral No. 367's *Entered Apprentice Degree* and Cypress No. 295's *Master Mason Degree*. Thanks to the help of some of our newest Brothers we have also built a strong catechism instruction team and revived the *Masonic Mentor Program*, bringing it into the 21st century, and assuring our new Brothers receive the instruction we all hunger for at that stage.

Close to my heart this year was our focus on food insecurity, which manifested itself in several ways. Our *Feeding Minds* food drive has helped keep Florida Gulf Coast University's Campus Food Pantry stocked this entire year thanks to your generous donations, positively impacting the food insecure student population that will one day soon be our community leaders. We were fortunate enough to assist *Midwest Food Bank* and learn about their nationwide fight against hunger and need, which inspired everyone involved. Our *Turkeys for Tice* project saw our Brother Senior Deacon raise an astounding \$4500 for the families of Tice Elementary School students, with the help of OES Fort Myers Chapter No. 31, leaving an indelible mark in the memories of those families your generosity helped touch. I've also personally enjoyed joining Cape Coral Lodge members serving the community at their Harry Chapin Food Distribution once a month.

Tropical Lodge and the Southwest Florida Masonic Center have seen significant growth in our group activities as well. We have started a *Masonic Bodies Committee* composed of all the Masonic Center groups, that has been fruitful for the Lodge and everyone who meets here. Our Brother Junior Steward started the Level and Square Market, which supports charitable efforts at the Lodge, and helps expose us to the broader community. After several years of work, Tropical Lodge is also now the host for the *24th Masonic District's Open Books*, bringing Brothers together for fellowship and education and helping us to improve our Masonic ritual. We have been blessed to work with the Lodges and appendant bodies in our district this year and look forward to many more memories together.

These are just a few of the wonderful things that have happened at Tropical No. 56 in the year 2024, all made possible because of you, and all proving that it is indeed hip to be square! I have not attempted to thank all of you incredible Brothers and Sisters by name, because the list is far too long, but you have humbled me with your support and enthusiasm. This has been one of the greatest experiences of my life, again made possible because of you, and I am forever in your debt. Thank you from the bottom of my heart!



Burl Ives



Burl Ives was an American musician and folk artist. (Born June 14, 1909 - Died April 14, 1995)

Ives was born near Hunt City in Jasper County, Illinois June 14th, 1909. As a young man Ives with active with both the Boy Scouts of America and the Order of DeMolay. In 1924, Ives was a Lone Scout which shortly after joined with the Boy Scouts of America. On September 5th, 1927, Ives joined the Order of DeMolay. Ives attended Eastern Illinois State Teachers College from 1927 to 1929. He never graduated. During his junior year he was in an English class and realized he was wasting his time. After an exchange with the teacher as he was walking out the door, Ives slammed the door and never looked back.

In the 1930's, Ives traveled around the country working odd jobs and playing his banjo. In Utah he was arrested for vagrancy and for singing "Foggy Dew" an English-Irish folk song that local authorities considered a "bawdy song". He also attended Julliard in New York during this time.

In the 1940's, Ives started his own radio show called the *The Wayfaring Stranger*, named after one of his songs. He also became a member of the Almanac Singers which at various points in time had other well known members including Woody Guthrie. The Almanacs were active with the American Peace Mobilization (APM). The APM was a peace movement trying to convince the United States to not get involved with World War II with various folk songs. When the Germans invaded the Soviet Union the Almanacs changed their tune, literally. They began writing folk songs encouraging American participation in the war.

In 1942, Ives was drafted and ended up being part of Irving Berlin's *This is the Army*. A traveling show to military bases to help to rally and support the troops. He was honorably discharged in 1943.

In the 1950's, like many performers, Ives was blacklisted for allegedly having communist ties during the Red Scare. Ives appeared before the House Committee on Un-American Activities. This got him off the blacklist and started a long time feud with fellow folk singer Pete Seeger. Seeger accused Ives of naming names.

Ives appeared in several films. He was in the film *Big Country* for which he won an Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor.

In 1964, Ives lent his voice to the CBS presentation of *Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer*. The stop animation featured Ives as the banjo playing host of the show Sam the Snowman. Two of the songs Ives performed in the show, "Silver and Gold" and "A Holly Jolly Christmas", were instant classics. The following year Ives recorded them for an album. He released them the next Christmas taking advantage of their previous success.

Through the 70's and into the 80's, Ives performed in various ways. He lent his recognizable voice and face to a Luzianne tea as their commercial spokesperson. He also worked with the U.S. Bureau of Land Management on their campaign "This is your land - Let's keep it clean".

In 1994, Ives, a smoker of pipes and cigars, was diagnosed with oral cancer. After undergoing several surgeries that were unsuccessful in removing the disease, Ives decided to stop any future surgeries. On April 14th, 1995, Ives fell into a coma and passed away.

Ives was a member of Magnolia (now Magnolia-La Cumbre) Lodge No. 242 in Santa Barbara, California being raised in 1977. He was also a member of the Scottish Rite, Southern Masonic Jurisdiction in the Valley of Santa Barbara in 1985. Ives was coronated a 33° Scottish Rite Mason in 1987. He was elected a Grand Cross, an honorarium added to the 33° in 1993.


