Greetings from the East

It's amazing to think we are almost halfway through the year already! I would like to thank everyone who has supported, encouraged, and guided our Lodge officers thus far. We are so much stronger together and we hope to continue serving you as we strive to meet your Masonic needs.

While we have big plans for the second half of the year, I want to take a moment to reflect on these past six months of Masonic activity, charity, and fraternity. Every year begins with a host of Masonic installations of the various Lodges and appendant bodies. We try to attend as many of these as we can to show our support for those people committed enough to accept the responsibilities of an officer for their organizations.



Several Tropical officers were able to travel to Fort Myers Beach No. 362, where we attended their installation ceremony and enjoyed friendship, fellowship, and their warm hospitality. I was also in attendance for the installation of officers of Cape Coral No. 367, the Fort Myers York Rite, and our resident chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star; I was warmly received by them all. The beautiful and solemn ceremonies helped to reinforce my own passion for the Craft and to serve it with my utmost determination.

At our February 20th communication, Worshipful Jeff Zimmerman and the officers of Tropical conferred the Fellow Craft degree on numerous Brothers, with another fantastic lecture delivered by Brother Chris Tilman. We

also performed courtesy work that night for a Brother from Punta Gorda No. 115 and welcomed a large group of their Lodge members who had traveled with him. It was a wonderful night of Masonic growth & fraternity and the degree team did an excellent job.

The season of Lent provided the opportunity for Tropical Lodge to join in on some charity work with Cape Coral Lodge by putting on a fish fry February 16th and 23rd, and on March 1st. It was an incredible success both in the funds raised for various charity efforts, and the opportunity to work side by side with our Brothers from the Cape. We plan to repeat these efforts next year.

On March 19th we celebrated St. Patrick's Day with our First Annual Kilt Night, which included the obligatory corned beef and cabbage (thanks to our Junior Warden Bob Zimmerman). We had six Brothers from three different Lodges participate, which was fantastic for a first showing; I think we can easily double that next year. That night also saw us visited by our Brothers from Fort Myers Beach Lodge in a "Traveling Gavel" exchange. As initiated by our Worshipful Jeff Zimmerman, the



gavel belonging to Worshipful Master John Herman was "borrowed" and they were left with a substitute of comical proportions. On April 16th we made some local Masonic history with our Brothers from Cape Coral Lodge. After opening, we passed control of the Lodge room to the officers of Cape Coral Lodge, who proceeded to initiate two new members into our fraternity and the Tropical family. This was a momentous event for both Lodges; it was something neither Lodge has done before and served as yet another bonding moment between our members.

On April 25th I attended the 55th Anniversary celebration of the chartering of Cape Coral Lodge No. 367. It was a lovely event that included oral histories delivered by various Past Masters, and the presentation of the Past Master's medal to their Worshipful members (including our own Worshipful Jeff Zimmerman), honoring them for their service to the Craft. Worshipful Master Pennewaert's invitation was appreciated; it was an honor to be at such a historic event for our Cape Coral Brothers.

On May 11th Cape Coral Lodge hosted The Entered Apprentice Degree Dissected with Right Worshipful Joe Fleites, which began with a fantastic breakfast beforehand. I had the pleasure of helping in the kitchen that morning, starting at 5:30 am. I would like to thank the Cape Coral officers for their hard work and effort to bring such an enlightening event to our district.

Capping off the (almost) first half of the year was the 195th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Florida, from May 26th through the 29th at the Rosen Plaza in Orlando. This annual conference is held for the purpose of voting on legislation and the installation of Grand line officers, among other important things. The Junior Past Most Worshipful Grand Master Glen Bishop led the proceedings with purpose and authority. A productive session was held and he ended his term with dignified remarks, thanking everyone for the support he received.

Our new Most Worshipful Grand Master Donald Cowart was installed with his elected and appointed officers. He laid out his plan to focus on education & ritual, and selected the Masonic youth pro-



grams to be his charitable focus. We look forward to supporting his initiatives and to another fruitful year under the guidance of the Grand Lodge.

Congratulations are in order for Right Worshipful District Deputy Grand Master Acey Edgemon Sr. and Right Honorable District Instructor Bruce Rivera for their appointments. We look forward to working with them in the coming Grand Lodge year.

We look forward to receiving him and his party as we begin this new Grand Lodge year.

On Saturday August 17th we will hold our Past Masters and Awards Night to honor the many people who have done (and continue to do) so much for our Lodge -- from our extensive list of Tropical and Lehigh Acres Past Masters to Master Masons of the Year, and more. This black-tie event will include a lovely dinner and light entertainment. We sincerely hope you will join us.

On Tuesday September 17th we will receive representatives from the Calusa Nature Center, who will explain their mission and activities, and be recognized as our charity of the month. They are likely to be accompanied by some animal ambassadors as well, which is sure to be exciting. That night will be a called communication, as we are also planning to hold an informal *Freemasonry 101* after our guests' presentation. 

HOUDINI NIGHT



JUNE 18, 2024 | SOUTHWEST FLORIDA MASONIC CENTER | 7:30 PM

Harry Houdini was a Hungarian-born American Illusionist and Stunt Performer, born on March 24th, 1874 in Budapest, Austria-Hungary (now just Hungary) as Erik Weisz.

He arrived in the United States on July 3rd, 1878 with his pregnant mother and four brothers. The family settled in Appleton, Wisconsin where his father served as a Rabbi. In 1887 the family moved to New York City, New York.

His magic career began in 1891 and initially had little success. He changed his name to Harry Houdini after a French magician named Jean Eugène Robert-Houdin. He initially focused on card tricks and even billed himself as the "King of Cards." Most magicians at the time saw Houdini as a competent magician, lacking the finesse for slight of hand

magic. Before long he started experimenting with escape acts.

In 1893, while performing with his brother "Dash," Houdini met his future wife Bess. She joined the act and a year later Houdini and Bess were married and the act was renamed to "The Houdinis." In 1899 Houdini met Martin Beck in Minnesota who booked the act on the Orpheum Vaudeville circuit. In 1913, Houdini introduced the Chinese Water Torture Cell where he was suspended upside down in an overflowing water tank while handcuffed.

Later in life as the President of the Society of American Magicians he wanted to keep professional standards very high by exposing fraudulent performers. In the 1920's he turned his attention to alleged spiritualists and mediums. He was a member of the Scientific American committee offering a cash prize to anyone who could prove their supernatural abilities.

Prior to his death Houdini and his wife Bess setup their own test for the alleged mediums. They decided on a code word; after Houdini's passing, he planned to communicate from beyond the grave if possible. Bess held séances for 10 years on Halloween none of them were successful. After the final unsuccessful attempt Bess put out a candle left burning by Houdini's picture since his death. She was quoted as saying "ten years is long enough to wait for any man."

Houdini passed away on October 31st, 1926. The official cause of death was peritonitis secondary to a ruptured appendix. Witnesses to an incident in Houdini's dressing room prior to his death said a McGill University student challenged Houdini about his belief in miracles in the Bible and whether it was true he felt no pain when he was struck in the stomach. The man began striking Houdini below the belt while Houdini was lying on a couch due to a broken ankle. Houdini was able to stop the man's blows, but the damage was done. After performing in the evening Houdini got a 102° fever.

Houdini was a member of St. Cecile Lodge No. 568.

Masonic Memorial Service


