THE MOVEMENT


A 2014 survey found that 92% of consumers believe it's important to know where their food comes from.



FILMING PLAN









With full support from Forrest Pritchard, Joel Salatin, and the Barryville, VA community, we are excited to film on location at the actual Smith-Meadows farm.

Filming at the real farm enhances the authenticity of the project and aligns with our goal of fostering a sense of community. It also brings a unique spotlight to the farm itself, adding significant value to the film.

Additionally, the Virginia location allows us to capture key scenes at iconic places like the Barryville and Arlington Farmer's Markets, both of which play crucial roles in the story.

For interior shots, virtual production, and other scenes not requiring on-location filming, we will also utilize TriVision Studios in Northern Virginia, about 2.5 hours from Barryville.

FINANCES

TOTAL BUDGET

The total all in budget to develop, produce, execute and deliver the finished film is \$4MM (usd).

REGIONAL TAX INCENTIVE - 15% qualified spending

The conservative net regional tax credit based on qualified spend and shooting in Virginia is \$375,000 (USD).

TIMELINE

From the point of greenlight, the production requires 6 weeks of pre-production, 6 weeks of principal photography and 20 weeks of post-production to deliver a finished product. This heavily depends on seasons due to the nature of filming on a farm. If greenlit past spring, production will have to wait until the next calendar year to film.

ROI & WATERFALL

After Investors recoup 120% of the principal, equity sharing ensues. Ownership is split 47.5%/47.5% between Investors (on a pro rata basis) and Producers, with 5% of profits going to an agricultural charity. Any 3rd party back-end participants (i.e. Talent) come from the Producer's 47.5%
