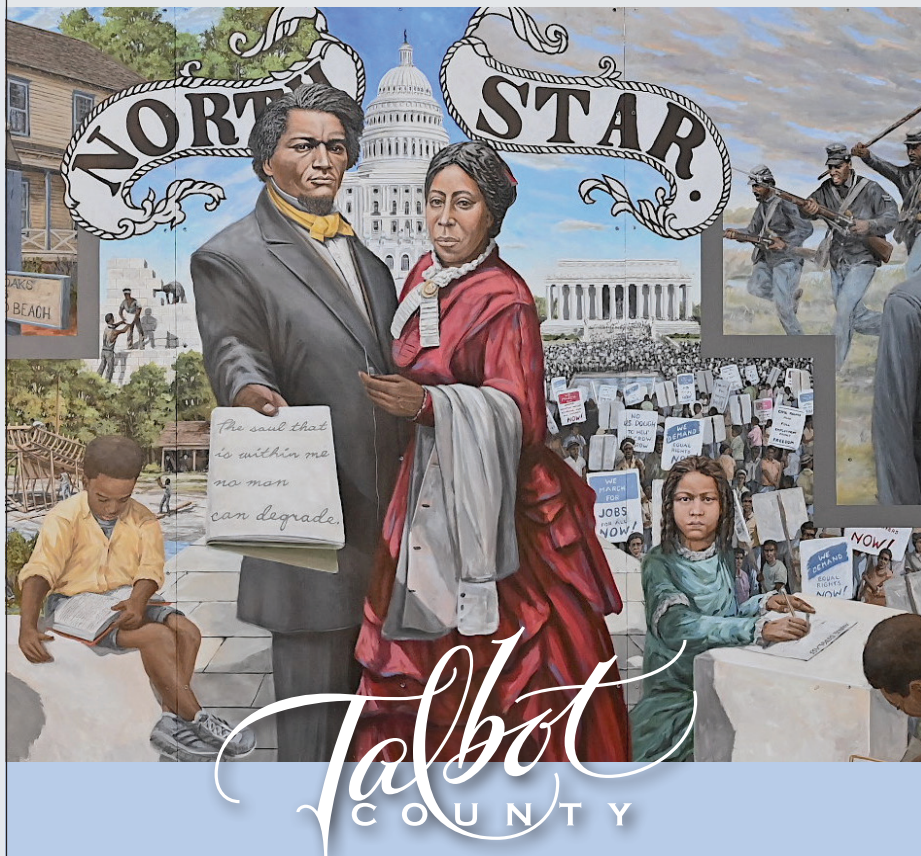

A young Frederick Douglass resided in Fell’s Point as a slave from 1826 until he escaped from American slavery on Monday, September 3, 1838 via the Underground Railroad. Lou Fields, President of BAATC created the Frederick Douglass Path to Freedom Walking Tour in historic Fells Point in February 2000. In 2001, C-SPAN covered the walking tour on their national TV network. On March 27, 2003 the City of Baltimore erected four historic markers honoring Douglass along the Path to Freedom Walking Tour route.

In 2005, the tour received acceptance into the National Park Service and the Maryland Network to Freedom Underground Railroad Program. In 2006, the Living Classrooms Foundation opened the Frederick Douglass-Isaac Myers Maritime Museum which is a stop on the tour.

This tour is always available daily by appointment and lasts about one hour. Tour guides lead attendees along the route where Douglass lived, worked and worshipped as well as the maritime sites and notables places in historic Fell’s Point. The tour is an excellent educational outing for students, educators, visitors, and persons interested in learning more about Baltimore’s role in immigrant, maritime, slavery, Underground Railroad and local history. The setting for the tour is in Fell’s Point, Baltimore’s original waterfront on the east side of the Inner Harbor. Fell’s Point features many unique retail shops, eateries, personalities and sights of old Baltimore.

About the Baltimore African American Tourism Council of MD, Inc.

The Council is a community-based nonprofit organization co-founded in March 1996 by the late Steven Pace and Louis C. Fields. The Council’s goals include the research, documentation, preservation, protection, and promotion of African American History, Culture and Tourism within the State of Maryland. BAATC is a one-stop shop for travel and tourism requests coming into the State of Maryland and other select cities. In year 2000, BAATC led to the establishment of Harriet Tubman Day in Maryland. 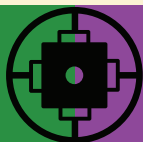

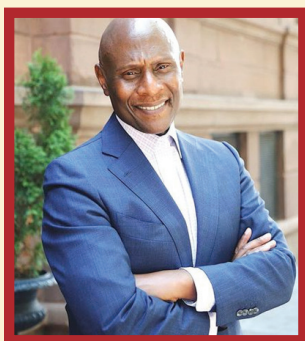

His rags-to-riches story began in the Baltimore projects amidst poverty and racial segregation, before overcoming obstacles to establish three

companies: BITHGROUP Technologies, Bithenergy, and through RobertWallace.com, EntreTeach.

Now, he shares his innovative strategies for success with other corporate and community leaders through his growing library of books and other content, and through his energetic keynote presentations and training workshops. Wallace earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering and Applied Mechanics at the University of Pennsylvania, and his MBA from the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College, where he began his research on the characteristics of successful entrepreneurs. He was also awarded a Doctorate of Humane Letters (Honorary) from Sojourner-Douglass College.

Bob is a passionate community leader and devoted church elder who believes in the intersection of spirituality and business. He's written six books on wealth creation, strategic partnerships, business spirituality, emerging markets and entrepreneurship. His books address the challenges faced by women, people of color, and entrepreneurs of all stripes from domestic and global emerging markets. Bill Jarmon

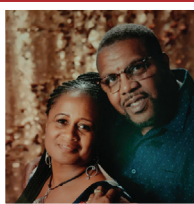
