Lake Maintenance Service Report

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The water levels remain in the normal full levels and down just slightly from last week. With the recent extreme heat the rate of evaporation is very high.

The Bayside, Cameo and the Rec Center fountains were running normally this week. The 103rd Av fountain remains down for repair.

Waterfall pump was operational and there is water movement in the lagoon and down the streams into the main lake.

The filamentous algae growth in the lagoon is treated in the fourth week of the month and the vectobac larvicide is done the first three weeks of the month. The spot treatments along the edge of the lagoon are helping keep filamentous growth in check in the summer months.

The once-a-month lagoon algaecide treatments have kept midge flies and algae growth in check without reducing the efficacy of the larvicide treatments.

The addition of more goldfish and the full vectobac larvicide treatments (in the lake and lagoon) this spring successfully reduced the spring midge fly populations.

The lake is well stocked with goldfish to consume larvae in the main lake and there was an addition of more goldfish and blue gill in the lake and lagoon in February and in April and there has been very little fish mortality since the last stocking.

The 4 street grates adjacent to the lake are treated with dry larvicide dunks once a month year-round (the first week of the month).

The slight cool down and some monsoons earlier in the month are over and we are in for a long period of extreme heat.

Water temperatures may increase slightly but the upper 80s are usually the upper levels for lake temperatures even in the hottest months.

No aquatic weeds seen. No bottom algae growth seen this week on the lake bottom or floating to the surface.

The fish stocking done when the lake was refilled has been very effective in keeping midges, bottom algae, filamentous algae and aquatic weeds under control. Based on the current lake conditions at this point I am not recommending adding any more fish in the fall (except the trout in the winter). The trout do not affect the lake conditions and are only for sport fishing.

No algaecide or lake colorant treatments needed in the main lake and the chemical usage has remained very low for the summer so far.

No surface planktonic algae blooms seen and no filamentous growth in the main lake.

No waterfowl mortality seen. The hottest months have the highest risk of avian botulism but no dead or sick birds have been seen.

No fish mortality seen.

The water levels are back to the normal levels so the boat ramp is treated with algaecide every other week as a safety precaution to reduce risk of slippery algae growth.
