Lake Maintenance Service Report

The water levels remain at normal full levels after the lake was refilled in November (2023) and some slight but not appreciable rainfall the past week.

All four of the fountains are operational; 103rd Av, Bayside, Cameo and the Rec Center and all fountains running this week. Waterfall pump was operational and there is water movement in the lagoon and down the streams into the main lake.

No bottom algae seen and limited planktonic algae growth in the water column so overall conditions remain excellent.

With the cooler night time weather and shorter days, the algae growth slows and there is an overall increase in clarity and decrease in turbidity in the cooler months.

The 4 street grates adjacent to the lake were treated with larvicide once a month.

There were no midges seen this week but I still treated the lagoon area with vectobac larvicide to complete a treatment. I will discontinue the treatment in the lagoon for now and resume if any midges are seen as we get closer to the spring.

Normal trash removal and debris was skimmed off the surface and just the usual trash.

There was some cooler and cloudy weather so the temperatures so the water temps dropped three degrees but little wind movement so not much of an increase in dissolved oxygen.

One seasonal migratory duck was dead and removed. Two dead fish, one trout and one bass.

The trout (1500 lbs) were delivered the morning of June 8th and no initial mortality or loss of fish seen. I found only one dead trout this week.

Periodic treatments are done twice a month with algaecide on the boat ramp have been suspended in the cooler weather and there is no new algae growth.
