Lake Maintenance Service Report

The water levels remain at normal full levels after the lake was refilled in November (2023) and a decrease from last week.

All four of the fountains are operational as of April; 103rd Av, Bayside, Cameo Bridge and the Rec Center. Cameo Bridge fountain is running but the nozzle is partially clogged.

With the extreme summer heat for the past few weeks the water temperatures are high but are largely stable and about at the upper limit. Some smaller lakes can reach 90 F but Viewpoint is larger with higher volume and doesn't get as hot as the smaller lakes.

There was some wind but little to no rainfall again this week so still no monsoons to help cool down the temperatures or add some rainwater to the lake.

The average lake clarity remains high, especially for the warmer months. There is some planktonic algae in the water column and a slight increase in bottom algae seen this week but overall very good condition for the extreme heat of summer.

There is loss of the coloration from the last dye application but that is normal as the sun breaks down the dye. When I treat again later prior the Labor Day weekend.

One small accumulation of bottom algae this week and again in the Bayside cove.

There was the usual trash, debris and palm husks in the lake, mostly along the north side of the lake (cameo drive)

The mats of filamentous algae that were treated earlier in the summer have died back and not returned

The waterfall is running normally as is the fountain and aeration in the lagoon area.

Periodic treatments (usually 1-2 times a month) with algaecide are done in the warmer months on the boat ramp are done as a safety precaution.

No waterfowl mortality or fish losses seen.

I am seeing both adult and juvenile bass in the lake that survived in the lagoon and the white amur and goldfish stocked in the lake are doing well with no losses.
