## Lake Maintenance Service Report

The water levels remain at normal full levels after the lake was refilled in November (2023) and no rainfall in the past three weeks.

There is rainfall forecast for the weekend and next week and there are several inches of space for runoff. The overflow for the lake is the wash area at the west side of the lake adjacent to 103<sup>rd</sup> Avenue.

All four of the fountains are operational; 103<sup>rd</sup> Av, Bayside, Cameo and the Rec Center and all fountains running this week.

Waterfall pump was operational and there is water movement in the lagoon and down the streams into the main lake.

The coloration from the dye application is completely gone from the recent rainfall last month and just over time. With a cool down there is a reduction in algae growth and we traditionally don't have issues with bottom algae in the winter (coolest) months.

The 4 street grates adjacent to the lake were treated with larvicide once a month.

Normal trash removal and debris was skimmed off the surface.

Water temperatures are too high and oxygen too low for the trout but safe for stocking of the other fish species. I will monitor and determine when the trout can be stocked. Generally, conditions are good starting late December into January.

The drop in water temperatures was slowing with the recent warm days and no rainfall in the past three weeks but with a cool down and rain next the temperatures will fall.

No issues with filamentous algae in the main body of the lake of the areas and no areas of floating bottom algae. There is a decrease in the biomass of planktonic algae in the water column and the clarity levels are increasing.

Periodic treatments are done twice a month with algaecide on the boat ramp have been suspended in the cooler weather.

No waterfowl mortality but a coot looked injured. There were 2 dead bass removed. I saw a couple more dead fish at the north end of the lake when I was driving by later in the week but unable to reach them.
