Lake Maintenance Service Report

The water levels remain at normal full levels after the lake was refilled in November (2023) and rainfall last week had no effect on the water levels.

All four of the fountains are operational; 103rd Av, Bayside, Cameo and the Rec Center and all fountains running this week. Waterfall pump was operational and there is water movement in the lagoon and down the streams into the main lake.

No bottom algae seen and still limited planktonic algae growth in the water column but with a warm up and spring temperatures the spring algae growth will start earlier this year.

The first two weeks of the month were unseasonably warm in the afternoon and only cool evening temperatures and the water temperatures starting trending up. With the short lived cool down over the temperatures will start to increase more rapidly.

The 4 street grates adjacent to the lake are treated with dry larvicide dunks once a month year-round.

I will start to treat for midges in the lagoon area on a regular basis starting next week; the water temperatures will be in the mid 60s by next week so warm enough for the treatments to be effective. There were some midge flies seen this week and they were all in the area of the lagoon and not the main lake.

The lake itself is already well stocked with goldfish to consume larvae in the main lake and the addition of more goldfish and blue gill in the lake and lagoon will help control midge flies.

There was some filamentous algae growth in the lagoon area but with the stocking of fish this week I did not want to add algaecide to protect the fish. I can treat as needed starting next week.

The goldfish and blue gill stocking was done the morning of the 24th for a total of 3000 fish. Approximately 100 goldfish and 100 blue gill were stocked into the lagoon area and I spread the fish across the lagoon. The remaining 900 goldfish (1 inch) and the 1900 blue gill were stocked in the main lake. About 400 of the blue gill were larger (3-4) inches because the fish farm did not have enough of the 2-inch fish (at no additional cost). The fish were stocked away from the boat ramp so the fish could swim off into deeper water to protect them from the predator fish. No mortality seen during stocking and no losses seen later in the week.

No waterfowl mortality seen. 6 dead fish total this week: 2 grass carp, 2 bass, one goldfish and one catfish

The trout seem to have acclimated well and no mortality seen again this week.

Periodic treatments are done twice a month with algaecide on the boat ramp and I will start those treatments next week.
