The water levels remain at normal full levels after the lake was refilled in November (2023) and levels are holding steady for three weeks at +2.5.

All four of the fountains are operational as of April; 103<sup>rd</sup> Av, Bayside, Cameo Bridge and the Rec Center. Cameo Bridge fountain is running but the nozzle is partially clogged.

Average surface temp: 81.5 F Average bottom temp: 81.0 F Salinity: 0.2 ppt Dissolved oxygen: 5.99 mg/L (surface) / 5.63 (bottom) Secchi: 6 feet 0 inches pH: 8.2 Current water levels: +2.5

Water temperatures are gradually cooling with the cooler nights and with possible rainfall and cooler temperatures in the immediate forecast the temperatures will drop more quickly over the upcoming weeks.

The color and clarity are still good after the last dye application and clarity levels are now up to 6 feet and the lake still has the nice blue / blackish tint from the dye.

There were no bottom algae mats floating on the surface of the lake and very little planktonic algae in the water column.

There was the usual trash, debris and palm husks in the lake, mostly along the north side of the lake (cameo drive) and some in the bayside cove but overall light trash. Removed a 3-foot section of a  $2 \times 4$  board from the east side of the lake.

The area of scum / foam in the lake where the west side of the of the stream enters the lake cleared up after the de-foam treatments.

Waterfall pump running normally.

Periodic treatments (usually 1-2 times a month) with algaecide are done in the warmer months on the boat ramp are done as a safety precaution. The ramp treatments will continue for October then I will treat as needed in the cooler months.

No fish or waterfowl mortality seen but the seasonal influx of migratory birds is starting. There have been an influx of coots and Canadian geese starting in early October.

I will keep everyone updated on the estimated date of the next fish delivery when the date is closer.
