
Baptism

As Christ, its giver, is called by many and diverse names, so also is His gift. Because of the great joy we experience either in regard to it ... or because of its many forms of benefit, we have many names for it as well. We call it gift, grace, baptism, illumination, anointing, robe of incorruption, washing of rebirth, seal, everything honorable. It is gift because it is conferred on those who bring nothing of their own; grace since it is given even to the guilty; baptism because sin is buried in the water; anointing for it is priestly and royal as are those who are anointed: illumination because it radiates light; robe since it covers our shame; bath because it washes; and seal as it is our safeguard and sign of God's Lordship. In this the heavens rejoice together, this the angels glorify because it is like their great radiance. This is an image of the blessedness to come. We desire to sing forth its praises, but we are unable to do so worthily.

Since we are twofold, I mean body and soul, and our nature is visible yet also invisible, the purification is also twofold, through water and Spirit. The one is received in a way that can be seen and is bodily, as the other joins with it spiritually and in a way that cannot be seen. And the one is symbolic while the other is true and purifies the depths.

The Solemn Blessing of flowers & herbs on Friday

Dormition liturgies. You may bring in flowers if you want them blessed as well.

According to our Byzantine Catholic custom, flowers and herbs are solemnly blessed on the Feast of the Dormition. Tradition teaches us that when Mary "Fell-asleep in the Lord" the Apostles put her in a tomb, and Thomas, not present for the burial, came later and begged to see Mary one last time. The other Apostles took him to the Tomb, but when they got there, the grave was empty. Only flowers and herbs were present where the Mother of God laid. As a reminder of this event, flowers are brought to the Church and blessed. After Divine Services, they are taken back home and seen not merely as a thing of beauty, but more importantly as a living sign of God's presence in nature and in our lives. The herbs, used by our people as natural medicine, are blessed in commemoration of the numerous healings and extra-ordinary graces bestowed on the pilgrimage at Mary's tomb. The blessing of the herbs on the Feast of the Dormition was introduced by the Fathers to combat the superstitious incantations and

The Holy Dormition of the Theotokos



On August 15th, we will observe the Holy Day of the Falling Asleep of the Mother of God



(Dormition). The Byzantine Catholic Church, in honoring the Mother of God, has determined celebrations in her name to be commemorated at certain times throughout the year. Nothing is said in Scripture about her last days. Many stories and legends have come to be told about her departure from this world. As this is one of the oldest Holy Days of the Church, we can learn much from the readings and prayers of the various services of the Day. We learn that all the Apostles except St. Thomas had been gathered

together to be with her at the end of her earthly life. As the troparion puts it: "She passed over into Life." A solemn procession was formed to carry her to the grave she had chosen in Gethsemane. St. Thomas came too late for the burial, but he wanted to pay his "last respects." He was taken to the tomb, but she was not there. The tomb was filled with fragrant flowers and herbs.

We can see why the proper word for this day is either Dormition or Falling Asleep. The Slavonic word is "uspenije." This means sleep, the Christian word often used for the final sleep. The Eastern Churches stress her repose and not her ascension, a later tradition which the Roman Catholic Church later stressed calling the Holy Day the Assumption. Since almost the beginning of Christianity, the Mother of God was honored by the celebration of her repose (uspenije). The troparion doesn't mention her assumption but rather her falling asleep. "In giving birth you did keep your virginity: in falling asleep you did not forsake the world, O Birth-giver of God, you passed over into Life you who are the Mother of Life, and by your intercession you do deliver our souls from death."
