Chevron Cuff



<u>Chevron Cuff</u>

Materials:

6 inches Chevron Chain 8 inches 5mm Flat Wire 3 feet 24 gauge Wire 12 4mm Fire Polish Beads

Instructions by Joyce Trowbridge

- **Tools:** 1 Bead Mat 1 Chain Nose Plier 1 Round Nose Plier
- 1 Wire Cutter

Step 1

Use Round Nose Pliers to start to curl one end of the **5mm Flat Wire**. Continue to curl the wire into a slight spiral. Use Chain Nose Pliers, if needed, to pull the curl inward.



Step 2

Take one end of the **24 gauge Flat Wire** and wrap around 4-6 times near the curl end of the Flat Wire.

Trim the small tail end of the 24 gauge Wire. Slide wraps closer to the curl end.





Step 3

String the **Chevron Chain** (*through the hole between the wings of the Chevron*) onto the 24 gauge wire. Secure the end of chain by wrapping the wire around the Flat Wire and the Chain (*between the first and second links*).





Step 6


Wrap the 24 gauge around the Flat Wire and the Chevron Chain to secure the next two links. String **1 Fire Polish Bead** and secure with a wrap.




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Step 4

Wrap the 24 gauge Wire around both the Flat Wire and the Chevron Chain, securing the next link.





Step 5

String **1 Fire Polish Bead** onto the 24 gauge. Let the Fire Polish slide down the 24 gauge and sit over the Chevron Chain. Bring the 24 gauge wire around to the back.



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Step 7

Follow Step 6 until you reach the last link of the chain.

Secure the end by wrapping the 24 gauge wire 4-6 times.



Step 8

Follow Step 1 to curl the second end of the Flat Wire. Trim the tail of the 24 gauge wire.



Step 9

Form the wire wrapped Flat Wire into a cuff shape.





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
