
2025 TN STATE CONVENTION **Have You Registered?**

Here are some additional details:


• Date: April 24th

PMG Dejoy Resignation



Search for New PMG Begins

On February 17, 2025, **Postmaster General Louis DeJoy**, informed the Postal Board of Governors that he was stepping down and the search for the next PMG may begin.

Dejoy took office in June of 2020 and had an uphill battle the entire time he was PMG. When DeJoy came to the USPS, he had to deal Covid-19 issues, followed by scrutiny on mail in ballots

He had to make multiple appearances to Congress to discuss his **Delivering for America** plan. During one of these sessions, the questioning got so heated, the PMG covered his ears.



Besides the DFA, DeJoy had other notable accomplishments including:

- **COVID-19 Response:** Under DeJoy's leadership, the USPS played a crucial role in delivering approximately 930 million COVID-19 test kits to 91 million households
- Operational Changes: DeJoy implemented several operational changes, including consolidating mail processing facilities, raising postal rates, and adjusting delivery standards to improve efficiency
- **Modernization Efforts:** DeJoy focused on modernizing the USPS, including introducing new package shipping products that have become popular in the marketplace

While his tenure has been controversial, DeJoy's efforts to transform and modernize the USPS have had a lasting impact on the organization.
