JANUARY 22nd, 2024



With so many options for wick material out there, you might be curious to know which one actually wicks water the best. I never gave it much thought since I've always used acrylic four-ply yarn with no issues other than one occasionally drying out on me. After some discussion with other growers, I became more curious. I devised a simple experiment to evaluate a few of the more common choices.

This is the experiment I conducted. I cut three equal lengths of nylon paracord, #18 three-ply nylon yarn, #18 braided nylon mason's twine, acrylic "baby" yarn, and four-ply acrylic yarn. I then thoroughly washed

with soap and dried the wicks. They were then hung from a small table and secured with tape to an empty glass baking dish. Water with a dark blue dye was added to the dish, and a ten minute timer was started. At the end of ten minutes, the length that the water had traveled was measured. After an hour the order had not changed, so I did not record those results.

Now, off to the races! Who will win?

Here are the photo finish results!!

Nylon paracord: 5.5 inches, 5.5 inches, 5 inches

Twisted Nylon: 6 inches, 6 inches, 6 inches Braided Nylon: 6.5 inches, 6 inches, 6.25 inches

Acrylic baby yarn: 2 inches, 2.5 inches, 2

inches

Acrylic four-ply yarn: .75 inches, .5 inches,

.25 inches

These tongue-in-cheek race results lead me to two conclusions. First: nylon is by far a better wicking material than Acrylic. Second: it is important to wet your wicking material to "prime the pump" since we know that acrylic does work as a wicking material, but apparently acrylic has a much harder time starting than nylon when dry. This leads to another problem for acrylic. If an acrylic wick manages to dry out, it would be much less likely than a nylon wick to begin working again on its own.

After more than thirty years wick watering with four-ply acrylic, it looks like I might be switching to braided nylon!
