
In lieu of a raffle Sandi Soto donated some plants and leaves to attending members.

MARCH 25th, 2024



This week I'm revisiting a topic covered back in 2021. I see so many questions about this topic and so many violets suffering from a lack of knowledge about it, that I thought I should cover it for our new subscribers and as a reminder for those who may have forgotten. So, let's talk about pot size!

The graphic above is an illustration of some of the wrong, as well as the right, pot sizes for African violets. The "golden ratio" for sizing your pot is 3:1. The plant diameter should be three times the size of the pot diameter. As an example, if the plant's foliage measures 9 inches across in diameter then the pot should be 3 inches across. you can see this illustrated above where green is the size of the plant and white is the size of the pot. African violets also do best in a pot that is more shallow rather than tall.

The 3:1 ratio may seem small, but it allows for adequate potting mix and nutrients while still encouraging blooming. Violets bloom best when they are slightly root bound. This ratio also helps prevent damage from overwatering in soil that is a bit too heavy by allowing the plant to more quickly use the available water. It will not solve all watering and soil problems, but it does give you more wiggle room than an oversized pot. I hope you find this tip helpful!
