## JESUS CALLS US TO BE LABORERS IN HIS VINEYARD.

Jesus in today's gospel (Matthew 9:36-10:8) sent the apostles to go and evangelize the world. Jesus lamented that the work to be done is plenty, but the laborers are few.

I think the laborers are few because many Christians are not active in their Christian vocation to evangelize the world. If all of us here become very active Christians today, the number of laborers will increase, and we shall bring rich harvest for God.

We can also increase the vocation to the priesthood in our diocese by encouraging our children, or grandchildren or great grandchildren to become priests. Last week we had one ordination in our diocese, Father Matthew Solarz. We need more priests.

Think seriously how you can help to increase the number of laborers in the Lord's vineyard. But very importantly pray as Jesus commanded us for more vocation, that more people will be interested in doing God's work whether as ordained priests or as lay faithful. The ministry of evangelization is for both the clergy and the laity. The ordained ministers have their own duty and the lay faithful equally have their own.

Today is Father's Day. In our country America, the third Sunday of June every year is Father's Day. We remember and honor all fathers, grandfathers, great grandfathers, spiritual fathers, and all those who have acted as fathers in our lives. We appreciate our fathers for the love, kindness, protection, care, and encouragement they have shown in our various families. We equally thank them for the support they have given to the family of the church of God.

When Jesus saw the crowd in today's gospel his heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Fathers are reminded today that they are shepherds in their various families. They are called to emulate Christ the Good Shepherd. They should be compassionate, loving, tolerant, forgiving and be ready to sacrifice for their families and for the family of the house of God here in St. Joseph. This is why fatherhood is a vocation.

We wish all the fathers a very happy Father's Day. We pray God to bless them now and always.
