DO NOT BE AFRAID, TRUST IN GOD.

Jesus while sending the apostles on a mission (Matt.10:26-33) instructed them not to be afraid but to trust in him always. The language “Do not be afraid” was used 365 times in the whole bible. And Jesus in the New Testament used it several times. In today’s gospel alone he used it three times.

We are the present-day apostles of Jesus. We preach the good news of Jesus every day with spoken words and with our good deeds. Jesus knows that there are many things that can bring fears and anxieties into our lives here on earth while living our daily lives as Christians.

First, there could be people who may hate us because of our Christian faith. There could be people who will insult us, say bad things about us because of our good deeds and the truth we stand for as Christians. This was what Jeremiah encountered in the first reading (Jeremiah 20:10-13). But God was with him to vindicate him. Just like Jeremiah Jesus encourages us not to be afraid of such people that He will be with us to defend us.

Jesus said, “Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather be afraid of the one who can destroy both body and soul in Gehenna.” The persecutions or challenges we face for being Christians can only affect our physical life; it can only inflict bodily suffering on us, but our souls are in peace and secured for eternal life. But if we deny Jesus and the gospel because of the fear of people, we may lose our salvation. God has the power to deny us salvation if we don’t practice our Christian faith publicly out of fear or shy. Jesus emphatically said that whoever denies him before others he will deny before his heavenly father. But whoever acknowledges him before others, he will acknowledge before his heavenly Father. So let us not be afraid of criticism or persecutions in professing our faith. Let us rather honor and obey God in all things and situations. He will reward us adequately at the appropriate time.

Again, as people in the world, we could experience fears arising from social insecurity. Just on

Saturday of last weekend, at night around 10 pm, burglars wanted to break into my house through the side door. When I noticed their attempt to break the door, I had to call 911. I was scared. Our fears could also originate from financial insecurity, health challenges, family problems, uncertainties of life, fear of what the future holds, ‘what ifs,’ and even fear of death and where we shall spend eternity.

Jesus assures us in today’s gospel that God shall take care of us and our concerns. If God can take care of sparrows (birds) which worth little, how much care shall he give us who are created in his image and likeness. 1Peter 5:7 “Cast all your fears unto Jesus for he cares about you.” The stronger the faith and trust we have in God the lesser the fears we have. When Jesus tells us not to be afraid, he knows that he is more powerful than our objects of fears. Let us place our trust and faith in him always.

Psalm 69: Call upon the Lord in faith, seeking His loving response. Endure insults and shame, trusting in His boundless kindness and mercy. Rejoice, for the Lord hears the cries of the poor and oppressed, and let all creation join in praise.
