

PARABLE OF THE WHEAT AND THE WEED ----GOD IS A MERCIFUL JUDGE

I once boarded a flight from Billings to Houston, Texas. There was a lady who was on board with us. This lady was very indecently dressed. When I saw her, I concluded in my mind that this lady must be a prostitute; and I was sure everyone on the plane who saw her dressing must have thought the same. But to my greatest surprise when the plane was about to take off, this lady opened her handbag and brought out her rosary and began to pray. I said to myself, "wow, this lady must be a devoted good Catholic." From that moment my impression of her and my attitude towards her began to change. I said to myself that this lady may not be a bad person.

Jesus in today's gospel (Matt. 13:24-43) told us the parable of the weeds growing together with the good seeds. When the servants of the gardener noticed this, they requested the master to allow them to pull up the weeds, but the master said NO, telling them that they could mistakenly pull up the good seed along with the weeds. He ordered that both the good seeds and the weeds should be allowed to grow together until the harvest time when he himself will separate them. There are few lessons Jesus wants to teach us through this parable:

We should not judge others because we can't judge correctly. We should not condemn anyone for we could condemn innocent people. Only God who sees the inside and outside of a person can be the best judge. We should therefore leave judgment to God.

Another lesson is that God is a merciful judge. Today's first reading (Wisdom 12: 13, 16-19) tells us that God is patient with sinners. He wants repentance of the sinners and not their destruction (Ezekiel 33:11). That was why God allows the good people and the bad to live together here on earth with the hope that the bad ones may realize their sinfulness and come back to him before the judgement day. The psalmist said "Lord, you are good and forgiving." (Psalm 86).

One important question we should ask ourselves today is: Who is a good person and who is a bad person? Who is the wheat and who is the weed? Am I good or bad? One truth we all must acknowledge is that there is always a mixture of good and bad in each human person. In so far as we are on earth, we are not yet perfect. We all have some weaknesses we must always fight against. We should try daily

to be better. Repentance is a necessity for each person.

The world is full of sinners and saints. Saints are not those who have no sins for all humans are imperfect. Saints rather are those who constantly make amends for their mistakes and try to avoid such mistakes. And this is how they will make heaven eventually. Sinners are those who refuse to repent and do not care about doing good and avoiding evil despite the graces and opportunities God has provided for them. Thus, they will eventually miss heaven on the last day. We are among the saints, the righteous. May we continue to make effort for the Holy Spirit assists us daily as St. Paul reminds us in the second reading (Rom 8:26-27) of today.
