THE TEMPTATIONS OF THE DEVIL

Today is the first Sunday of lent. Lent provides us an opportunity to discipline ourselves to overcome Satan and his temptations. The devil is real and very active in the world. As he tempted our first parents in the first reading (Gen.2:7-9:3:1-7) and as he tempted Jesus in the gospel (Matt. 4:1-11) so he tempts us every day. Temptation is the devil's attempt to make us disobey God and so lose friendship with God. He succeeded in the case of Adam and Eve, but Jesus defeated him.

Satan tempted Christ with pleasures, power and pride-3Ps. The first temptation – if you are the son of God command the stones to become bread-pleasure, materialism, gluttony. Satan wanted Jesus to indulge in earthly pleasures. He wanted him to become slave to materialism. But Jesus overpowered him.

The second is for Christ to jump down from the pinnacle of the temple. Here Jesus was tempted to make wrong use of his divine power. As God, Jesus would have easily jumped down from that height without getting wounded. He doesn't even need the angels to guide his feet. But jumping down from the pinnacle of the temple was unnecessary. It will only attract for Jesus worldly fame and glory which was not why he came into the world and that will be abuse of his divine power. Thus, Jesus turned him down. We should learn from this temptation not to abuse any power we have.

The third temptation is for Christ to worship the devil and so receive the kingdoms of the world and all the wealth in it. Jesus rejected the offer. There are people today who have been deceived by the devil to worship him. Satan has his followers and worshippers. We have satanic temples in some places in the world where Satan is worshipped the way we worship the living God. But such worshippers of Satan will end up in hell fire where Satan lives. Satan is a proud creature who refused to acknowledge the supremacy of God.

The devil tempts us every day with these 3Ps- pleasures. power, and pride. Always note that the plan of the devil is to destroy us as he destroyed our first parents. St. Peter encourages us to be alert and watchful because our enemy the devil is roaming around like a lion looking for someone to destroy. Stand up to him strong in faith. (1Peter 5:8-9) Satan is very clever, cunny and intelligent. He knows human psychology very well and can use it against us. Don't engage in argument with the devil because he is very good at argument and can easily convince you to do wrong. That was the mistake Eve made. Instead rebuke the devil! Use the bible to respond to him as Christ did.

God always supports us with his graces in our daily struggle with the devil, and he cannot allow us to be tempted beyond what we can bear (1Cor. 10:13). We pray for more of his graces.
